## "NRHEG Competition Cheerleading"

The NRHEG Competitive Cheerleading teams are made up of cheerleaders who strive to support and boost spirit at the school along with promoting positive sportsmanship through competition. Routines not only showcase sideline skills using signs, poms, and megaphones, but also perform challenging choreographed  $2\frac{1}{2}$  minute routines to music that include stunts, jumps, and tumbling as well. Teams are judged by a panel of cheerleading experts on difficulty and execution. The goal of competitive cheer is to have fun, gain experience and make great memories that last a lifetime, as well as learning cheers, stunts, dances, jumps, patience, persistence, teamwork, and communication. Our student athletes develop qualities in areas such as self-confidence, respect, responsibility, mental and physical strength, courage, and focus just to name a few!

At NRHEG our Competition Cheer Teams consist of a Middle School (5-9<sup>th</sup> grade) and a Varsity (8-12<sup>th</sup> grade) Team. Routines are choreographed by Northern Elite during the summer & tweaked or modified throughout the season by our coaches and students based on the ability and skill level of the athletes. Teams travel to competitions to compete 3-5 times per year & also perform locally at school athletic events throughout the season.



Not only are all teams trying to be the best in their prospective divisions, but Varsity is also vying for bids ("invites") to compete at the National High School Cheerleading Championship held in Orlando, Florida in February. This is the third year in a row the Varsity Competition Cheer Team won their state competition and were also invited to Nationals in Orlando after qualifying during a regional competition. The team was able to fundraise the amount needed from our local community businesses & members to travel to Florida where they placed  $\Pi^{th}$  out of 40 total teams in the nation! Incredible!!

Has there been a birth in your family? Have you recently moved into your neighborhood? Is there a new family in your neighborhood? ISD 2168 wants all families with young children to know about our programs and activities. Being on the school census also ensures that you will receive information regarding Early Childhood Family Education classes, Early Childhood Screening, and the Panther Preschool program information. In addition, funding for our Early Childhood Programs is based on the number of children on our census.

It is important that everyone be counted! To be added to the census, please call Karla at our school office, 417-2605 or find the form on our Community Education Website at www.nrheg.k12.mn.us under the community education tab.

Early childhood screening is mandated by the State of Minnesota for all children entering Kindergarten. The best time to have your child screened is between the ages of 3 and 4.



# Flag Football



## NRHEG CLAY TARGET TEAM

**Grades:** 6-12. Available in both fall and spring, this league is for students who have a valid gun safety certificate and have an interest in shooting sports. This is the fastest growing high school sport in MN! The State Class Championship represents the largest youth trap shoot in the nation and the MSHSL State Tournament is currently the only one of its kind in the nation.

<u>Fall League:</u> begins in mid-September and goes for 6 weeks with no state shoot at the end. It's a great way for students to introduce themselves to the sport before the Spring League. Registration for the Fall League begins in August so being on the mailing list before school starts is very important. Shoots are held at the Owatonna Gun Club.
