REGISTRATION



Students and families can register for Summer School using Skyward Family Access. Families can log-in to Skyward Family Access by accessing the homepage of our district website or any school website.

Registration is a one step process, with families selecting their student's classes. Register your student at the grade level they will enter during the fall of the 2023-2024 school year.

TO REGISTER IN SKYWARD

1. Login to [Skyward Family Access](#)
2. Click on "Summer School Registration"
3. Select your child's name (this process will need to be completed for each child separately)
4. Follow the steps that take you through the registration. You will need to update family information and select the date and periods/paths for participation.

Please note that your student will be placed on a waiting list if registration is full.

4K - 3RD GRADE STUDENTS



Families can choose to sign up for one or two sessions. Sessions and periods will be selected during registration.

Session 1: June 20 to July 7
(no summer school July 3rd and 4th)

Session 2: July 11 to July 28
(no summer school on July 10th)

SCHOOL SITE

Students in 4k - 3rd grade will attend Fruzen Intermediate School for summer school.

PATHS/PERIODS

Students can choose to participate in both the “A” and “WE” Paths.

DAILY “A” Path WITH BREAKFAST (Period 1)

7:45 am - 10:30 am | Summer Learning Academic Camp

The “A” Path focuses on academics in literacy and math. Students will engage in standards aligned learning that is both fun and academically focused. In addition, students per recommendation in grades 1-2, will participate in the “I am a reader” opportunity bridge as a part of this session.

DAILY “WE” Path WITH LUNCH (Period 2)

10:30 am - 12:15 pm | Summer Learning Wellness & Enrichment

The “WE” Path focuses on wellness and enrichment. Students will engage in opportunities to explore hands-on, project-based learning, with embedded arts educational experiences along with activities that promote physical movement and games.

4TH - 8TH GRADE STUDENTS



Families can choose to sign up for one or two sessions. Sessions and periods will be selected during registration.

Session 1: June 20 to July 7
(no summer school July 3rd and 4th)

Session 2: July 11 to July 28
(no summer school on July 10th)

SCHOOL SITE

Students in 4th - 8th grade will attend Fruzen Intermediate School for summer school.

PATHS/PERIODS

Students can choose to participate in both the “A” and “WE” Paths or they can choose to attend for one period (either period 1 or 2).

Period 1 - 7:45 am - 10:30 am

Period 2 - 10:30 am - 12:15 pm

The “**A**” Path courses are focused on **a**cademics in literacy and math, and “**WE**” path courses focus on **w**ellness & **e**nrichment.

The “WE” path courses will range from physical activities to areas of interest. *Course selection will follow after registration, students/families will receive additional information.*

HIGH SCHOOL

Summer School for our 9th - 12th grade students will consist of a six-week session from June 20 through July 28 (No school on July 3rd, 4th, and 10th).

SCHOOL SITE

Students in 9th - 12th grade will attend Aldrich Intermediate School for summer school.



COURSE OFFERINGS

Students can register for Summer School starting April 28th. **Access the High School Summer Learning Course Catalog** to view course offerings.

Courses that are available will have blended learning (virtual, in-person, hybrid) opportunities that vary depending on the course. Incoming Freshman have the opportunity to earn Physical Education, and Health credits.

Grades will be provided in certain classes, when appropriate.

A summer 2022 graduation ceremony will be offered as an opportunity bridge to Seniors that complete all graduation requirements identified during the 2022-23 school year.

Is there a limit to the number of students who can register for Summer School?

Yes, there is a limit. Your student will be placed on a waiting list if registration is full. We encourage you to register your student as soon as possible.

Will transportation be provided?

Transportation is available at the beginning and end of each school day (corner stops) for families that are eligible. Families must be registered for Summer School by **May 16th** to have busing for the first day of school.

EXPECTATIONS

ATTENDANCE

Attendance will be taken daily. For the best possible experience for our students, we ask for consistency in their attendance. We do understand that some level of flexibility is necessary during the summer. Students participating in credit recovery courses will need to have consistent attendance to meet credit/graduation requirements.

BEHAVIOR

During Summer School, school behavior protocols apply as outlined in the Family Handbook. Students are subject to disciplinary action and removal from our Summer School program for inappropriate behavior.

PROGRAMMING

The intention of our 4K-8 summer programming is to provide opportunities for students to grow in their academics and participate in enrichment activities.

Students in High School concentrate on credit recovery and support in academics.

Courses will run based on staffing ability and final schedules may change due to staffing.
