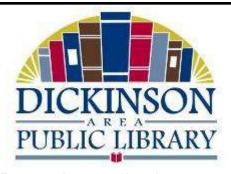

Studies have shown that early education goes a long way to preparing children for kindergarten. The National Institute for Early Education Research Director W. Steven Barnett, PhD say, "Children who attend high-quality preschool enter kindergarten with better pre-reading skills, richer vocabularies and stronger basic math skills."

A well-balanced preschool program will help increase your child's competency in all the major subject areas.

The value of early childhood education is that it gives children a good foundation on which to build for their succeeding years in school—besides academics, students develop a good sense of self and family, and learn that their actions, no matter how small, can help make the world better.
