Be Respectful



When we are respectful:

The Importance of Student Attendance

attendance?

Attendance is participation in an educational program, agreed upon by a school district, board of education, and state governing body designed to educate students within a specified timeframe.

District Policy and Regulations

- Students between the ages of 6 and
 16 must attend school regularly
- Student attendance is reported to state and federal agencies for monitoring
- Students who are absent are required to complete missed assignments
- Prolonged or repeated absences may result in retention
- Excessive absences will results in the denial of students participating in extracurricular activities or athletics



Student Attendance

Chronic Absenteeism

Defined as missing 10% or more days of school.

- For example if there are 180 school days,
 18 days would be 10% of the school year.
- If a student misses 10% of school days,
 they are considered chronically absent
- Students who are defined as chronically absent will require an action plan and parent meeting to address attendance issues
- 10% of the school year is almost ONE
 MONTH of school!!



WITH YOUR HELPOur goal is to:

Decrease

schoolwide chronic absenteeism to 15%

Maintaining Good School Attendance

- Create a routine at home to ensure your child is getting enough rest
- Talk to your child about their school day in order to display your interest in their education.
- Plan family trips during school breaks
- Plan doctor appointments outside of school hours whenever possible
- Create plans for emergency situations



What is the PowerSchool Parent Portal?

The parent portal is an online portal accessible anywhere on the web that parents can log in to and see all of their children in one place, their grades, assignments, scores, attendance, schedules, and school bulletins for each school your children attend. If you have one student in middle school and one in high school, parents will see bulletins for both the middle school and high school.

Why is PowerSchool Important?

→ Keeping up to date with your child's progress is vital to their success. PowerSchool will allow you to check grades or attendance often and make sure your child is accountable for their academic progress.

How often should I check PowerSchool?

→ Some parents check PowerSchool on a daily basis and others check PowerSchool weekly. It our suggestion that you check at least 2-3 times a week as a new middle school parent.

Dress Code and Expectations

Dress Code Guidelines

- Shirts must have a sleeve or thick strap
- Shorts, dresses, and skirts must meet mid-thigh
- Jeans should have minimal rips or tears
- No unapproved head coverings
- No inappropriate messaging on clothing
- All shoes and footwear must have a back
- Crocs should be in 'sport mode'
- Pajama clothing is not permitted to be worn in school
- Sunglasses or goggles are not permitted to be worn on face or head
- Mid-section should not be shown
- Additional expectations as noted by school or district administration

PBSIS Point System

NEPTUNE MIDDLE SCHOOL POSITIVE POINT SYSTEM

What incentives will my positive points earn me?

- Every student begins each school year with 500 points.
- Students must meet the posted point requirement in order to participate in all "regular" NMS
 extracurricular activities, events, and programs.
- 650 points: Recognition at the Celebration of Excellence
- 800+: Special High Earner Activity
- Top points earner (one per grade): \$25 gift card
- Referral Free: Ice Cream Sundae Event
- Each month that a student does not receive a disciplinary referral, 25 points will be added to his/her yearly total.
- Points are either added for positive behavior or subtracted for a disciplinary infractions monthly.

Any student with fewer than 250 points will not be permitted to individually participate in NMS activities.



Class Cut/Leaving Class without Permission/Cutting SNAP (-50 Points)


