Summer Reading Assignments:

1. Read selected chapters of *How to Read Literature Like a Professor REVISED* by Thomas C. Foster. the link is <u>HERE</u>, but it is recommended that you purchase the book if you plan on continuing into Honors 10 and AP Lit. Access the assignment <u>HERE</u> (DUE AUGUST 19) Upload to <u>www.turnitin.com</u> using class ID **44080101** and enrollment key **summer-jp** In the HTLLP notes. This is a 20-point assignment.

Read ONLY the following chapters.

"The Intro"

Chapter 1 "Every Trip Is a Quest"

Chapter 4 "Now Where Have I Seen Her Before?"

Chapter 12 "Is That a Symbol?"

2. Read the novella *Animal Farm* by George Orwell and answer the questions. Link <u>HERE</u> for the pdf of the book, or pick one up from the library or a bookstore. As you read the novella, complete the <u>questions</u> and the Socratic guide <u>HERE</u>.

On September 5, 2024, you will participate in a special discussion called a Socratic Seminar. This is an all-hour discussion run completely by students without any teacher input. The purpose of the discussion is to explore the novel to develop a deeper understanding of the themes, ideas, and historical context. To prepare for a thoughtful academic discussion, you will need to complete the assignment. The Socratic counts for 30 points. See the rubric HERE, I will go over the protocol for Socratic seminars in class.

You will also take a 25-point quiz on the book involving characters, setting, plot, and allegory.
