Community: Neptune Township is located in Monmouth County, New Jersey. It is a culturally diverse community of approximately 27,000 residents.	Curriculum: Neptune High School offers a fully diversified curriculum of content area including electives in art, business, communications, engineering, music, NJROTC, and vocational/technical fields through shared-time program with Monmouth Vocational-Technical Schools.
High School: Neptune High School is a comprehensive public school accredited by Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools and the New Jersey Department of Secondary education.	Honors Courses: The purpose of Honors courses is to provide students with an accelerated and expanded approach to the curriculum across most content areas. Neptune High School offers over 28 Honors courses across all grade levels.
Enrollment: 1127 Total Students 09th Grade: 261 10th Grade: 269 11th Grade: 289 12th Grade: 308	Advanced Placement (AP) Program: Neptune High School is Proud to offer students an opportunity to gain college credits by enrolling in year-long AP courses totaling 10 credits. Students enrolled in courses are provided the opportunity to sit for the AP Exams free of charge.
Scheduling: Neptune High School utilizes semester based block scheduling. A typical schedule consists of 4 courses in the fall semester and 4 courses in the spring semester. 8 total courses for a possible 40 total credits per year.	AP Courses Offered: AP Biology AP Calculus AB and/or BC AP Chemistry AP English Language and/or Literature AP Env. Science AP Physics 1 AP Afr. Grading Scale: Students are graded on a numerical scale 1-100% with 65% as the minimum passing score. Additional weight is added to AP (+15), Honors (+10), and College Prep (+5).	Dual Enrollment: Qualified seniors can apply to participate in the Dual Enrollment Program at Brookdale Community College. Eligible students may take up to 3 college credits during senior year. Courses are taught on the Brookdale campus by Brookdale professors.
Class Rank: Class rank is calculated after the completion of 6 semesters. It is determined by the average of the final grade plus applicable added weight.	Jumpstart Programs: The Neptune High School JumpStart Programs provide students with an opportunity to explore academic and career options after school. NHS offers programs in Education, Engineering, Environmental Science,, Law & Criminal Justice, and Medical Science.
Graduation Requirements: In addition to meeting the state graduation assessment requirements, graduates for the Class of 2020 must accrue a minimum of 120 credits which must include 20 credits in English, 15 in Math, 15 in Lab Science, 5 in World History, 10 in US History, 5 in World Language, 5 in Fine or Performing Arts, 5 in Practical Arts, 5 in Financial Literacy, and Health/Physical Education each year of enrollment.
