

#### How Do I Become a Sophomore?

- Students earn a credit for each class with a "D" or higher.
- A specified number of credits earned each school year is required to advance to the next grade level.
- Earning an "F" in a required course → must retake class and earn a "D" or higher.
- This information is listed in the Program of Studies:

#### Promotion

Students working toward a **Standard** or **Advanced Studies Diploma** will be promoted based on credits earned:

Grade Level	Credits Required	Credit Information
Tenth Grade (Sophomore)	5	A student must have earned a minimum of five (5) credits.
Eleventh Grade (Junior)	11	A student must have earned a minimum of eleven (11) credits.
Twelfth Grade (Senior)	17	A student must have earned a minimum of seventeen (17) credits.

Grade level advancement for students working towards an **Applied Studies Diploma**, including those receiving instruction following the Virginia Essentialized Standards of Learning (VESOL), who participate in the Virginia Alternate Assessment Program (VAAP), will be assigned a gravel level based on the student's four year cohort.

#### **What Does GPA Mean?**

- GPA = Grade Point Average
- Each letter grade is worth points
- GPA is calculated by adding up the point value for all final grades and then dividing by the total number of courses taken
- This information is listed in the Program of Studies:

#### Students' grade point average will be determined by assigning point values to courses as follows: Quality Points Per Credit

Advanced Placement and AP Exam	Dual Enrollment, MVGS, or JHHS Advanced Placement Courses, w/o Exam	All Other Courses
A-5	A – 4,5	A - 4
B - 4	B = 3.5	B - 3
C - 3	C - 2.5	C-2
D-2	D - 1.5	D-1
F - 0	F - 0	F-0

#### **Updates for Next Year:**

- We will operate on a 4x4 schedule
  - Students will take 4 classes in the fall and 4 different classes in the spring.
- AP English and AP US History will still operate on a yearlong A/B schedule.
  - If students take AP English they must take APUSH
  - If students take APUSH they must take AP English
- All CTE courses are paired (scheduled together) with an English class.


