What Do Credits Mean?

- Students earn a credit for each class in which a grade of "D" or higher is earned.
- A specified number of credits earned each school year is required to advance to the next grade level.
- See page 5 in the Program of Studies for more information.

Grade Level	Credits Required
Tenth Grade (Sophomore)	5
Eleventh Grade (Junior)	11
Twelfth Grade (Senior)	17

What Does GPA Mean?

- GPA = Grade Point Average
- Each letter grade is worth points.
- GPA is calculated by adding up the point value for all final grades and then dividing by the total number of courses taken.




