Last year the Corinth Band had an extremely successful entrance into 5A, earning 6th place at State Championships.

In the fall, Corinth Marching Band earned all superior ratings at State Marching Evaluation in Tupelo, earning their second consecutive trip to State Championships.

The band looks to entertain the crowd and judges alike with their 2024 Marching Show, "Entranced."

The band will host the Crossroads Marching Classic on September 28, compete in the Northeast Marching Championships on October 5, and travel to Tupelo on October 12 for State Marching Evaluation. They will compete at State Championships in Jackson on October 26 if they earn an overall superior rating at State Evaluation in Tupelo.

Corinth's Golf program had an excellent Fall 2023. Both the boys and girls teams won the Alcorn County Tournament for the second consecutive year. Both programs finished first in the Region 1-5A tournament held at Ole Miss Golf Course. This finish gave the teams some momentum headed into their respective State Championship Tournaments.

The girls team was headed up by Camden Lewis. Camden finished second in the State Tourney, narrowly missing the medalist position by three shots. The girls finished third overall in the State Championship. The girls team finished the season with six tournament wins. With Camden Lewis back coupled with our #2 golfer Ella Davis, along with senior Madeline Brooks and newcomers Zela Davis, Caroline Lum and Olivia Hines, our girls are looking to compete for the top spot in 5A this year.

The boys team looks to be a strong contender again this year. The team lost one senior and everybody else is returning with a ton of valuable experience. The boys team played 18 dates last season (2023) and finished with 14 top 3 finishes, 1-3rd place,

four-2nd place and nine wins. Add a Region 1-5A Championship and a State Championship and that makes an 11 win season.

The boys won the State Championship by 34 shots over its nearest competitor, Gautier, from the South. Corinth had five golfers finish in the top eight individually during the two-day championship tournament. Henry Huggins was the top golfer in 5A by shooting a two-day total of 160. Coming in second place was Baylor Pratt with a two-day total of 161. Occoe Pina finished fourth with a 163 and Timmons McGrath was sixth with a 164. Our lone senior from last year's championship run was Leland Davis, who rounded out the top eight. Brody Robbins (8th grade last year) finished T-14 out of 51 golfers in 5A. All except Davis will return this fall. Sprinkle in John Stanley, who has three years of State Championship experience along with Nyles Smith, Will Matthews, Jack Davis, newcomer Swayzee Hartnell, Jacob Hines, Charlie Elliott and Mason Reece, the Warriors should have a very competitive year again in 2024.
