College and Career Promise

- Dual enrollment with the community college to earn high school and college credits
 - Tuition provided by the State
 - Textbook reimbursement up to \$50 per course provided by UCPS
- College transfer pathway available to juniors and seniors with a 2.8 unweighted GPA or higher

Academic Difficulty of Courses

- Level 1: College Prep- Course content, pace, and academic rigor follows standards specified by the <u>North Carolina Standard Course of Study</u> (NCSCOS) with content enrichment where appropriate.
- Level 2: Honors- Course content, pace, and academies rigor place high expectations on the student and surpass standards specified by the NCSCOS. These course demand greater independence and responsibility that Level 1 courses. *This level is suggested for competitive college admission.*
- Level 3: Advanced Placement- Course content, pace, and academic rigor are college-level as adopted by the College Board to prepare students for college.

Academic Difficulty of Courses

- **Honors:** Students must be RECOMMENDED by their current teachers. Test scores are also factored into this decision (once received in the summer).
 - If you are recommended for an honors level course and decide you would rather take the course at the CP level, you may do so.
 - o If you are recommended for CP and wish to take honors, your parents should reach out to your teachers and counselor. Students who do this typically struggle in the honors level course.

Registration Timeline

February 20th:

- Registration presentation posted online for parents and presented in homeroom for students
- Counselors available in all lunches for questions
- Rising Senior College Information Presentation: 5pm SVHS Auditorium
- Optional drop in Q&A 5-7pm SVHS Cafeteria
- **February 20th-March 6th:** Students work with parents and current teachers to determine best course selection and enter those courses in PowerSchool
 - Put 8 top choices and 4 alternate electives in to powerschool by March 6th.
 - Alternates are just as important as primary choices. More than likely you will be placed in at least one of your alternate choices, so please choose wisely.
 - 3rd period teachers will collect transcripts and registration sheet on March 6th and redistribute on your scheduled meeting day
- February 29th: 5-7pm Optional drop in Q&A for help with course selection and entering courses into PowerSchool
- March 6th-21st: SVHS counselors meet one-on-one with students to review course selections (bring your worksheet and transcript with you)
 - Your 3rd period teacher can tell you your exact meeting date and time.

Registration Process

Entering Course Selections in PowerSchool

- Sign in to PowerSchool through the startup page
- Click "Class Registration" located on the left of the screen
- Click on the pencil icon on the right-hand side of the page next to each course subject listed to choose a course in that subject area
- Once you have selected your course(s), click "okay" and continue to the bottom of the page to hit "Submit"
 - Do this for each core subject (English, Math, Science, and Social Studies) and for the alternates section
- Make sure you register for 8 primary and 4 alternate electives


Accessing the Online Registration System

• Select "Class Registration" on the left hand side.




 Next, select the pencil icon to the right of each category to view courses in that category.



Accessing the Online Registration System

- In each category, select the appropriate class(es) and select "okay."
- Continue to the bottom of the screen and hit "submit" to return to previous screen.
- You will not be able to submit your requests until you have 8 top choices and 4 alternates selected
 - *Rising seniors can submit with only 8
- **Course selections must be in the system no later than **March 6th!**
