#### 1) Central Linn Education Endowment Fund

Current or post-graduate of Central Linn High School who is currently, or will be, attending a two- or four-year college. Emphasis placed on attending a two-year school and community service.

#### 5) Frasier Memorial Scholarship

Current or post-graduate of Central Linn High School. Priority will be given to applicants who exemplify the potential to be successful in their chosen endeavor. High academic achievement is not a requirement for this scholarship. Application may also be made by contacting the Frasier Family directly.
