

OHSAA & LHS ATHLETIC ELIGIBILITY

- Class of 2029 students MUST
 - pass at least four courses taken during the <u>final</u>
 grading period of their eighth-grade year to be eligible
 for the 1st quarter of your 9th grade year AND
 - have a **GPA of 1.5** for the fourth quarter.
- As OHSAA regulations require, students can apply for a one-time GPA waiver during their first year after completing four one-credit courses.
 - Submit applications to Mr. Meeker from the end of the 8th grade through the 3rd quarter of their 9th grade year.
- Note: PE/Conditioning, Summer School courses, and AP Science Labs DO NOT count toward high school eligibility.

High school students must take and pass 5 classes each quarter with a min. 1.5 GPA to remain eligible for athletics.



AP classes offer students a GPA boost as an A in an AP class is worth 5 points and an A in a college preparatory class is worth 4 points.




AP chemistry, like many other AP classes uses a college level textbook.






