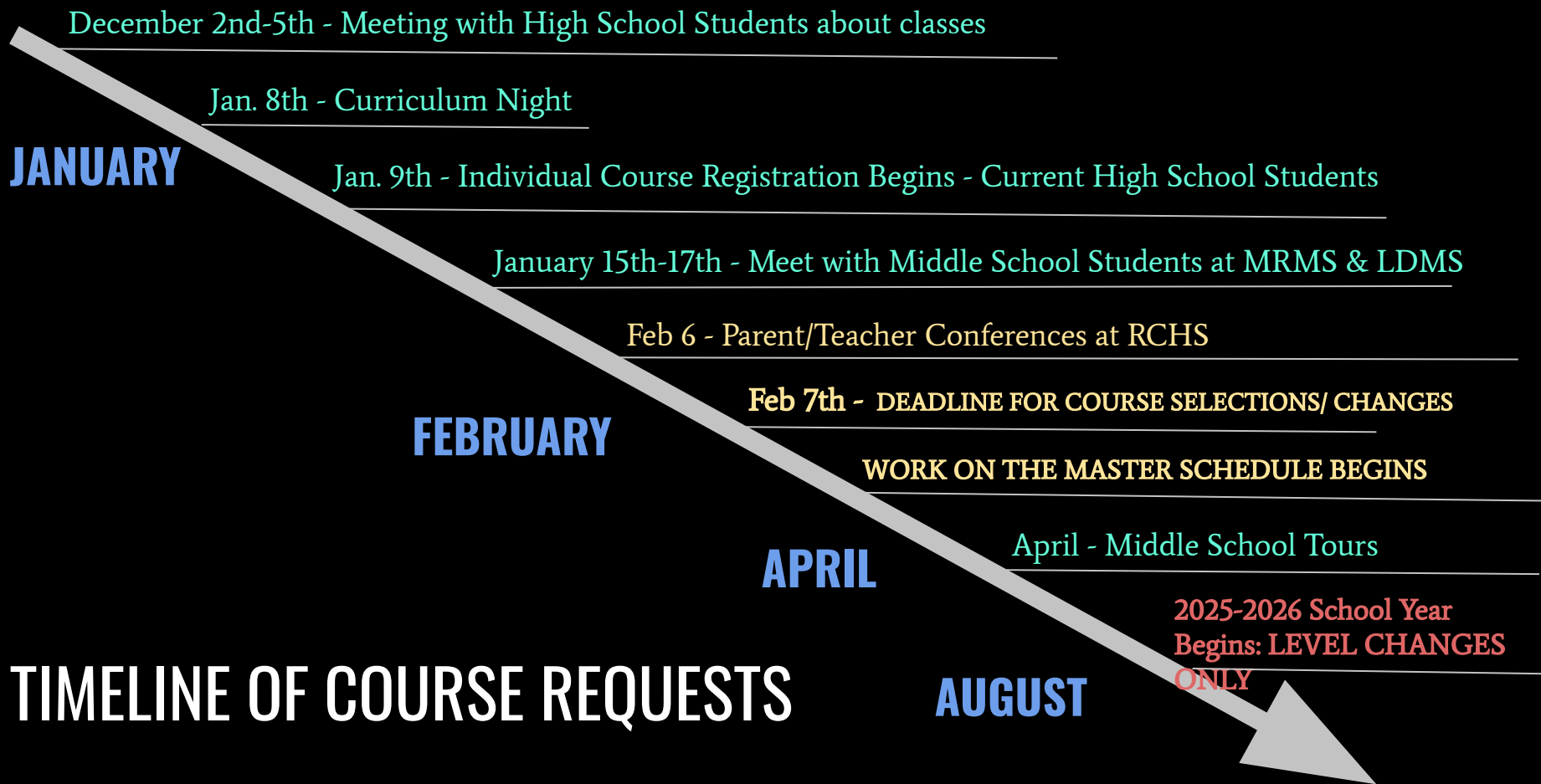

Additional Graduation Requirements:

Each graduate will also have earned CTE Certifications OR complete a Work-Based Learning Experience OR take and pass AP or DE courses.

CTE Certification

To earn a CTE Certification, a student must complete a complete sequence of classes and pass the Industry Credentialing Test.

A complete sequence of classes usually consists of a Level I course and a Level II course, though this may vary by Program.

Work Based Learning (Internships)

A career exploration opportunity linked to one of their high school classes that allows students to work and earn high school credits in a paid or unpaid position.

Allows students to gain critical work skills, valuable work contacts, and determine if a career is the one for them, all BEFORE graduation.

What's the difference between Honors, AP, and DE?

Honors	AP - Advanced Placement	DE - Dual Enrollment
<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Receive an additional 0.5 GPA Boost● Does <u>NOT</u> count towards the Additional Diploma Requirements	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Receive an additional 1.0 GPA Boost● College credit may be awarded based upon AP testing scores	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Receive an additional 1.0 GPA Boost● Requires admission to MGCC● Minimum GPA requirements for admission● Low grades can impact financial aid & academic standing in College BEFORE even getting there.

- ☐ Consider the Additional Requirements (CTE Sequence & Credentialing Test, OR an AP/DE Class, OR a Work Based Learning Experience)
