Agreement for Inter-district Cooperative Educational Services 2021-22 School Year

This agreement is hereby entered into by and between the Sedro-Woolley School District No. 101, Skagit County No. 29, which is hereafter referred to as the "serving district" and the Concrete School District No. 011, Skagit County No. 29, Washington, hereinafter referred to as the "participating district".

The purpose of this agreement is to utilize inter-district cooperation, authorized by RCW 28A.355,160, RCW 28A.225.250, and Chapter 392-135 WAC, to support parental school choice pursuant to RCW 284.225and Chapter 392-173 WAC, by providing educational programs not otherwise available or suitable, and to avoid duplication of specialized programs and facilities. These objectives will be achieved by the following describes cooperative process:

The Sedro-Woolley School District will provide an appropriate school year program for identified student(s) from the participating district consistent with each student's Individualized Education Plan and the rules and regulations of the State of Washington. This education will be provided within existing district programs, so long as those programs continue to be offered by Sedro Woolley and so long as the student complies with the rules of conduct for the program. Transportation of students to and from facilities where program services are located will be the responsibility of the participating district and shall be provided in such a manner as they consider appropriate.

The estimated cost of serving this student (L.B.) in the SWSD Structured Learning Program will be \$106,053 (including \$102,632 regular school year plus \$3421 for extended school year of 12 half days with 1.5:1 paraprofessional support and therapy provided in accordance with the student's ESY IEP) to be paid in monthly amounts as invoiced by the serving district. Services for said student will include speech language, motor services, and a 1.5:1 paraprofessional as indicated by an updated evaluation and Individualized Education Plan. Because all, or the majority, of the student's special education services will be provided by the serving district, the Sedro-Woolley School District will include the student in the Washington State Basic and Special Education Counts, directing the funds back to Concrete School District as the resident district.

This agreement is for the 2021-22 school year only, and for the student agreed upon, requires approval by each district's school board. Signed copies of each respective school district minutes or resolution approving the agreement are available for inspection at each respective school district administrative office.
