ARRIVAL AND DISMISSAL PROCEDURES MORNING ARRIVAL • Please use the designated car drop off area in the rear of the school by the new gym. *No child* should be dropped off in front of the school Car drop off begins at 7:15 and ends at 7:35.

#### AFTERNOON DISMISSAL

- Students cannot be checked out after **2:30 p.m.** If a child has an appointment please check them out before this time.
- Afternoon car/bus changes cannot be made after **2:30 p.m**.
- Parents/guardians must be physically present in the office to check students out.

#### ATTENDANCE

- Principal contact made on 3rd day, 5th day, and 10th day missed
- After 10 days unexcused absences the student is considered truant and referred to the truancy officer.



# DRESS CODE HIGHLIGHTS

- Shorts, shirts, and dresses may be worn in all grades and must reach at least two inches above the knee.
- All shirts and pants shall fit at the normal waistline. Oversize clothing shall not be permitted.
- Clothing with holes, rips, or tears may be worn if skin is not exposed.
