- Due to the pandemic, state statute (PI 8) governing school district standards was modified allowing districts to implement innovative instruction design.

Full-Time Open Enrollment:

• The interdistrict public school open enrollment program allows parents to apply for their children to attend public school in a school district other than the one in which they reside. For more information, please see the DPI website at: https://dpi.wi.gov/open-enrollment

Part-Time Open Enrollment:

 Under part-time open enrollment, a pupil enrolled in a public school in the high school grades may attend public school in a nonresident school district for the purpose of taking a course offered by the nonresident school district. A pupil may attend no more than two courses at any time in nonresident school districts. For further information, please see the DPI website at: https://dpi.wi.gov/open-enrollment/ptoe

Early College Credit Program (ECCP):

• ECCP allows Wisconsin public and private high school students to take one or more courses at an institution of higher education for high school and/or college credit. Under this section, "institution of higher education" means an institution within the University of Wisconsin System, a tribally controlled college, or a private, nonprofit institution of higher education located in the state. While technical colleges are not eligible institutions under the new program, pupils that have completed 10th grade will continue to have the option to take courses at technical colleges through a separate statute, 38.12(14). Start College Now Program:

 Start College Now is a program that allows qualified high school students to take college-level degree courses at Blackhawk Technical College or Madison College. For further information, please see the DPI website at: https://dpi.wi.gov/dual-enrollment/start-college-now

Youth Apprenticeship Program:

- The Wisconsin Youth Apprenticeship program, authorized in 1991 by the Wisconsin Legislature, provides high school juniors and seniors with the opportunity to explore their chosen career while still in high school. Students receive occupational related instruction and on-the-job training as part of their regular high school schedule and they leave high school with a state skill certificate and career related work experience. The program prepares students for all options after high school, whether it's directly into the workforce, a technical college, or a university.

*Transcripted Credit Agreement Courses:

Transcripted credit classes are Blackhawk Technical College classes taught
at your high school by your high school teacher. Students who earn a grade
of 70% or better in the class receive high school credit as well as a grade on
a Blackhawk Technical College transcript during high school. Pages 11-12 of

*Advanced Standing Courses:

Advanced Standing courses provide students with a high school grade and credit for prior learning once they are admitted to Blackhawk Technical College. Other Wisconsin technical colleges and UW schools may also accept that credit. To become eligible for this credit, the student must receive an 80% or better in the class. *Special Note: Due to changes in policies by the Higher Learning Commission effective in <u>September of 2023</u>, the Transcripted Credit and Advanced Standing will be requiring the Milton High School staff member teaching the course to hold a master's degree in their course discipline.

This will change the number of classes we will be able to offer beginning in the 2023-2024 school year as many of our instructors do not hold a master's degree in their specific subject area.
