Overview of ESSER Funds & Safe Return to In-Person Instruction and Continuity of Service Plan Requirement

The American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARP) made a third round of Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER III) funds available to schools. Ashland Elementary School was awarded \$609,427.82 of ESSER III funds and previously received \$271,090.95 of funds through Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2021 (CRRSA) Elementary and Secondary Emergency Relief (ESSER II). The ESSER II and ESSER III funds in the combined amount of \$634,211.08 are being used to support the installation of mechanical ventilation for the School. Additionally, funds have been used to support an additional Teacher (2021 – 2022; 2022 – 2023) to address through academic interventions unfinished learning for students. The School District for ESSER III funds must meet a statutory requirement to review and, as appropriate, revise its *Plan for the Safe Return to In-Person Instruction and Continuity of Services* at least every six months through the award period, but the School District will not need to submit updated plans to the New Hampshire Department of Education for the 2023-2024 school year.

- Normal pre-COVID-19 school operations will be in place for the 2023 2024 school year.
- All academic, social, and emotional supports including access to food will be provided through in-person learning at Ashland Elementary School. There will not be a remote option provided this school year.
- Any requirements related to COVID-19 required by the New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services and New Hampshire Department of Education will be met.
- Expectations for individuals experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 will be communicated by the School Nurse at the start of the school year and will meet the requirements established from the NH Department of Health and Human Services. Updates will be provided as required.
- Information regarding cases of COVID-19 within the School will not be communicated unless the School District is directed to do so by the New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services.
- Individuals have the personal option to wear a face covering.
- Families with concerns, should make an appointment to discuss them with Mr. Guy Donnelly, Principal and other staff as appropriate.
