Registration Process

- October 24: Grade Level Registration Informational Meetings
- October 24: Parent Informational Meetings
- Students will enter their course requests through their ParentPortal Student Account with their school counselor.
 - Current 11th graders: October 31 - November 10
 - Current 10th graders: November 13- November 21
 - Current 9th graders: December 7-15 & January 8-18
 - Make ups: January 2023

 - Must score high enough on exam to qualify for college credit (usually a 3)
 - Run by: College Board
 - National
 - Fee(\$98) for exams

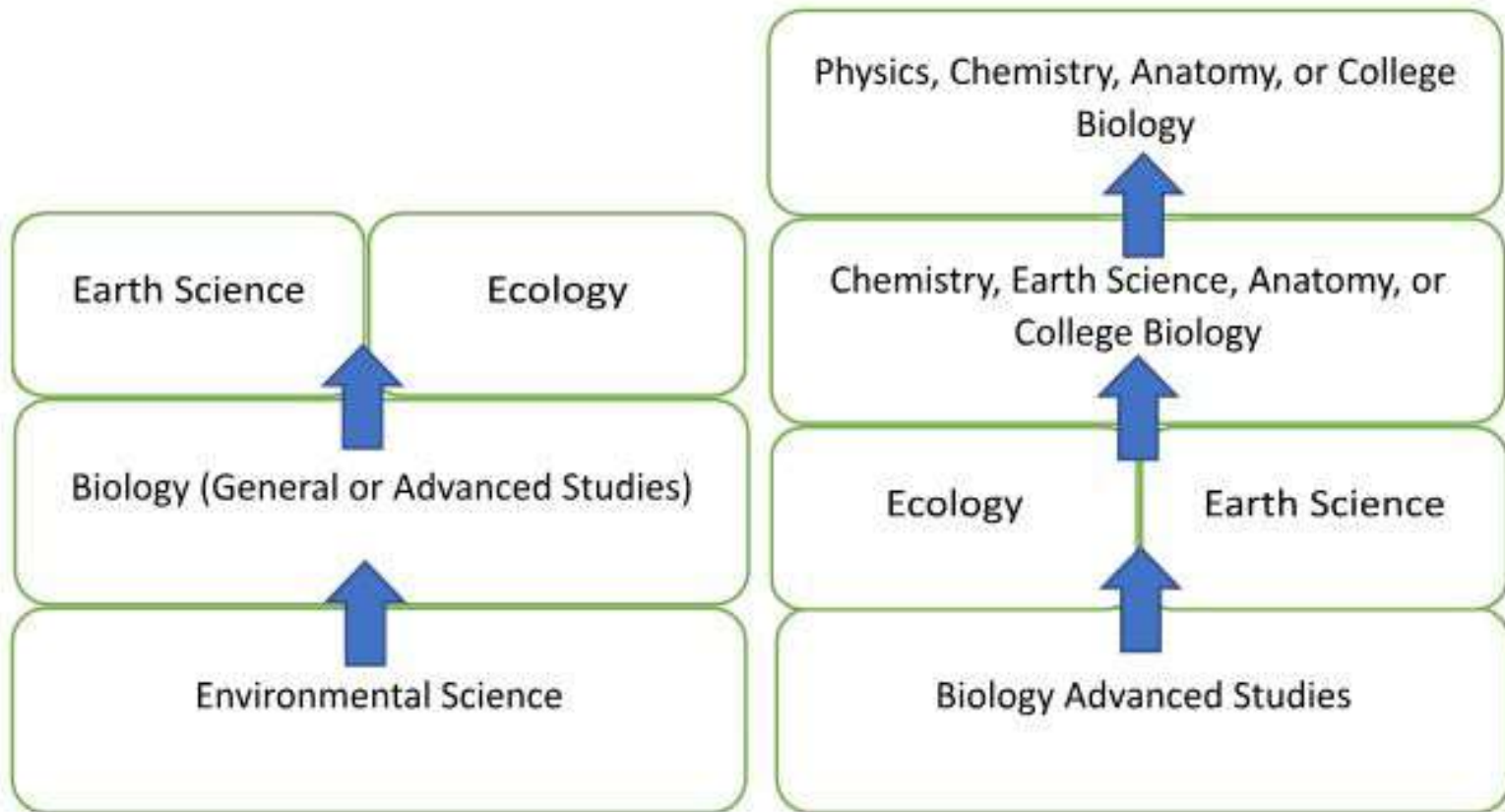

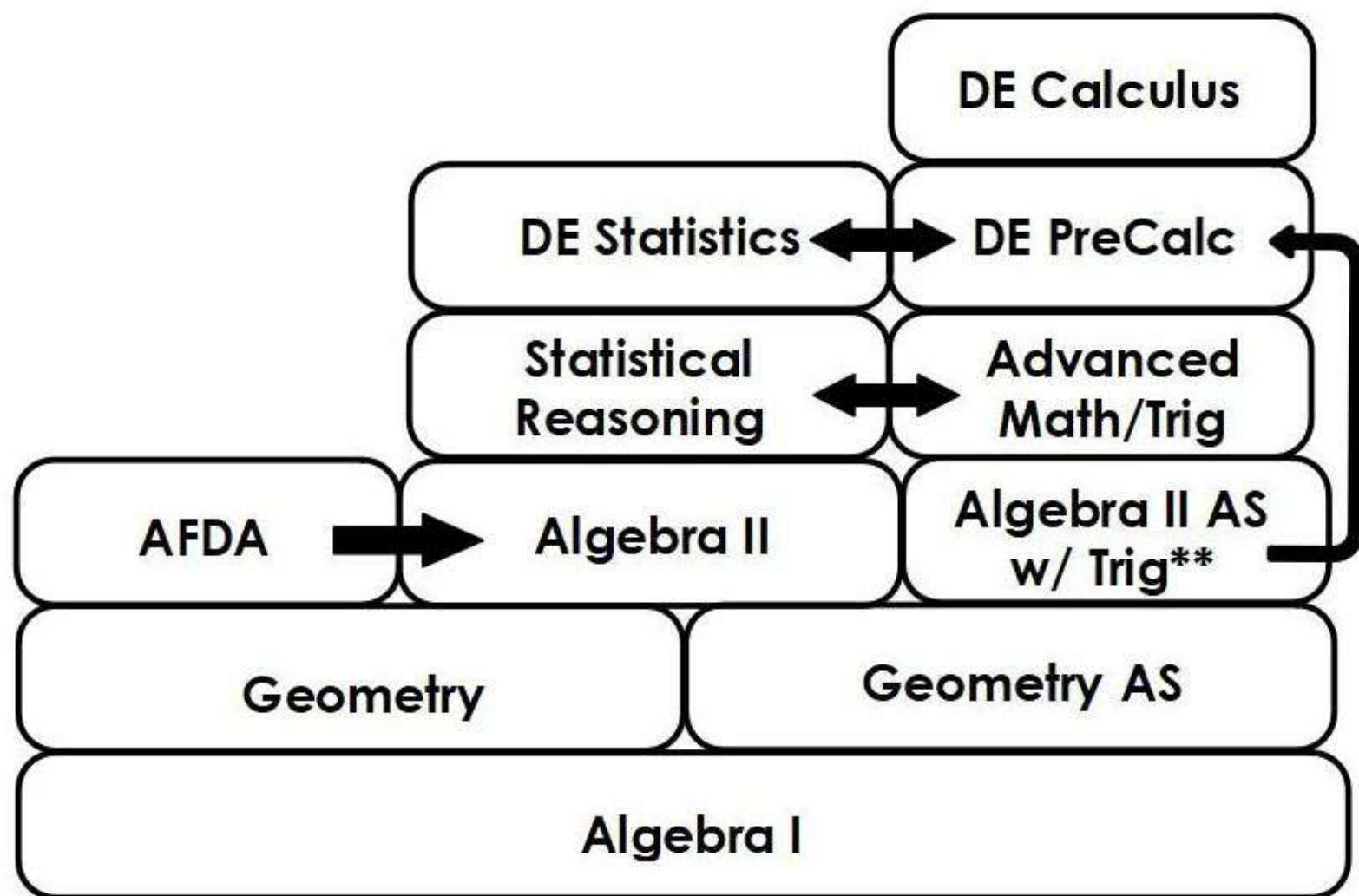


*If a student getting an Advanced Diploma takes **Biology AS in 9th grade**, they will need to take both **Chemistry** and **Physics** before they graduate.*

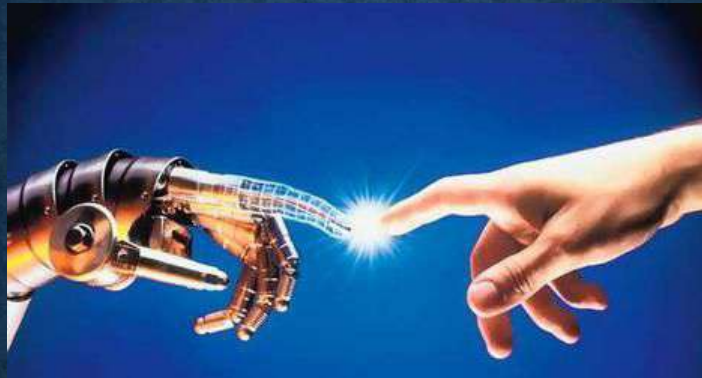
Dual Enrollment – Off Campus

- ▶ Students will take care of their own registration at the community college.
 - There may be a form that needs a counselor signature to enroll.
- ▶ Students will need to apply and qualify through the community college system.
- ▶ Pay 100% Tuition
- ▶ Payment is made directly to the community college
- ▶ Course must be able to be used toward an Associates Degree or certificate program
- ▶ Students will need to show their counselor verification of enrollment

Regional Academies

- ▶ Held on VWCC campus in the morning.
- ▶ Juniors and Seniors only
- ▶ Full tuition paid directly to VWCC
- ▶ Programs include:
 - Air Conditioning & Refrigeration
 - Engineering
 - Mechatronics
 - Health Sciences
 - Nurse Aide Program
 - Pre-Health Program
- ▶ Applications are due **second semester**.

REGIONAL ACADEMY

ELIGIBILITY

- Students should be a high school aged junior or senior
- Must have a 3.0 HS GPA
- Must have completed Algebra I with a “C” or higher

HOW TO APPLY

- Apply to VWCC
- Complete the on-line Academy application
- Teacher recommendation form
- Community leader form
- Under 18 Parent Signature Form
- Copy of the HS transcript

About the Regional Academy

Classes take place at Virginia Western

- Taught by Virginia Western Faculty
- May be in-person or on-line (check your schedule)
- You will need a computer that meets the VWCC standards
- You will use CANVAS as a means to communicate with your instructor, upload assignments, etc.

Monday through Friday

- 8:00 a.m. – 10:45 a.m.
- Student transportation unless provided by the high school
- VWCC Academic Calendar (Different than the high school calendar)

TUITION and Books

- Students are responsible for tuition, textbook
- Program may have special computer requirements

Funding for the Regional Academy

Dual Enrollment Students do not qualify for traditional college financial aid

- State appropriation for Health-Related Occupations. This is year-to-year with no guarantee of renewal
- Must Apply, Maintain a 2.5 GPA, take all classes in the sequence, be sincerely interested in a health professions related programs (see website for complete details)
- NOT ALL CLASSES are covered
 - Health Related programs
 - Mechatronics
 - IT

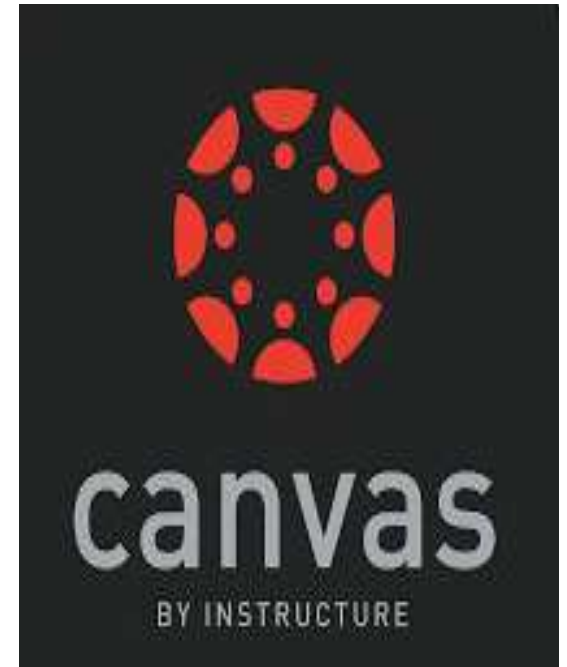
