*Option 1: Comic Strip

Directions: Using your own artistic skills or an online resource, such as http://www.toondoo.com/ create a comic strip illustrating the sequence of main events in your book

*Option 2: Alternate Ending

Directions: Create and write an alternate ending for <u>your</u> book. Be creative in your planning, considering how a different ending might change the outcome for characters. The ending should still maintain the original characters and progress logically (make sense).

Example: Think about how different the story of the "Three Little Pigs" would be if we consider the story from the wolf's point of view. What if the wolf made friends with the last pig, instead of trying to blow his brick house down? How would the story end?
