Supplies:

- Notebook, either three ring binder (all handouts will be hole punched) or spiral notebook with folders.
- Scientific Calculator TI~30IIXS
- Pencils and erasers

Textbooks:

- Textbooks will be used for homework assignments and do **not** need to be taken to class

My Expectations:

- Be on time and fully prepared to learn
- All homework assignments completed on-time
- Actively participate in class by asking and answering questions while creating a supportive, engaged, and intellectual environment.
- Effectively work in groups and individually
- Follow directions
- Ask for help when you need it
- Be an active participant in your education
- Start to work as soon as the bell rings. The harder you work in class, the easier homework will be at night. The more we accomplish in class, the less you will have to do for homework.

Day-to-day Instructions:

- There will usually be a "To Do" assignment written on the board.
- Upon entering the classroom, take out your homework and begin working on the "To Do"
- After completion, review homework with neighbor to clarify mistakes or misunderstandings

Homework:

- Homework will be given daily. You are expected to complete all assignments.
- Please make sure your homework is neat, legible and organized including textbook used, page number(s) and questions answered.
- While correcting homework, indicate the questions you struggled with or need more practice with. This will aid your studying process.
- Homework will be checked most days. I will be looking for effort rather than accuracy. Therefore, BE SURE TO SHOW ALL WORK.
- Showing all of the work, putting an honest attempt to all problems and making meaningful corrections will ensure a high homework grade.
- I do not accept late homework assignments.
- The harder you work on your homework each night, the better prepared you will be for class the next day.
- The Bumby book provides answers to the odd questions. Check your answers as part of your assignment.

Grades:

- During each quarter you will typically take 2-3 tests. Tests are cumulative. If legally absent, you are responsible for making up a test after school or during a free period. This must be done within a timely manner.
- Quizzes will usually be announced in advance. However some shorter quizzes could be unannounced.
- We will miss about 5 weeks of school because of Internship and other A-School commitments. To reduce class time needed for review, you will be given graded take-home assignments which will include review and challenge problems. These are on top of daily homework. You are encouraged to work together and with other peers to solve the problems. Expect test questions requiring a thorough understanding of these take-home assignments. You will have 5 or 6 per quarter.
- I use numerator over denominator grading policy. Meaning, I add all the points you earned for each test, quiz and graded homework and divide the sum by the total possible points you could have earned. This grade will represent of your quarter mark.
