Chapter 5 Lesson 2 New European Colonies

French Settlements

- Samuel de Champlain was a French explorer who explored the <u>St. Lawrence</u> River looking for the <u>Northwest Passage.</u>
- 2. The <u>Northwest Passage</u> was a water way connecting the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans.
- 3. Champlain founded the colony of **Quebec** on the St. Lawrence River.
- 4. This proved to be a good location because **<u>beavers</u>** could be trapped, and their fur could be sold for huge profits in Europe.
- 5. The French colonies, Quebec and Montreal, were also known as New France.

Dutch Settlements

- 6. <u>Henry Hudson</u> was an English sea captain sent by Dutch leaders to find new waterways to Asia.
- 7. Like Champlain, Hudson sailed up a wide river, hoping it too would prove to be the **Northwest Passage.**
- 8. Later this river was named the Hudson River.
- 9. The Dutch colonies became known as New Netherland.
- 10. In 1624, Dutch settlers began building the town of <u>New Amsterdam</u> on Manhattan Island.
- 11. New Amsterdam was taken over by England and is now known as New York City.
- 12. No one ever found the Northwest Passage because it doesn't exist!!!
