Skills and Assessments

Reading/Language: Scholars will compare and contrast two or more characters, settings, or events in a story or drama, drawing on specific details in the text (e.g., how characters interact).

Math: Scholars will add and subtract fractions with unlike denominators (including mixed numbers) by replacing given fractions with equivalent fractions in such a way as to produce an equivalent sum or difference of fractions with like denominators.

Social Studies: Scholars will list the problems of the Articles of Confederations such as lack of executive branch, no taxation power, and weak central government.

Science: Scholars will obtain and evaluate scientific information to describe basic physical properties of atoms and molecules.
