Mathematics "Big Picture"

Three math courses offered in 8th Grade:

- Algebra 1 Enriched
- Year One of Two-year Algebra I Experience
 - Year One (8th grade) Foundations of Algebra
 - Year Two (9th grade) Algebra 1 Modeling with Functions
- Pre-Algebra 8
- At this time, HS graduation requirements include Algebra 1,
 Geometry, and a third year of mathematics, typically Algebra 2.
- Many students not only meet these requirements, but often study beyond them in Pre-Calculus and Calculus.
