Fall 2021 Programming: Participation Data

Participation in STS afterschool programs for 3-8th graders has returned back to pre-pandemic levels.

- Attendance went from mid-50s to 70% for after-school programming, and eligible participants went from 55% to 78%
- In-person programming has proven to be more effective and has returned a sense of normalcy to students, family and staff
- 3rd grade launched in January - has been a success so far!
- Focus on afterschool programs in SY21-22:
 - Homework support
 - SEL Second Step Curriculum (Growth Mindset, Emotion Management, Empathy & Kindness)
 - STEAM enrichments
 - College partners (BU, BC and Simmons)

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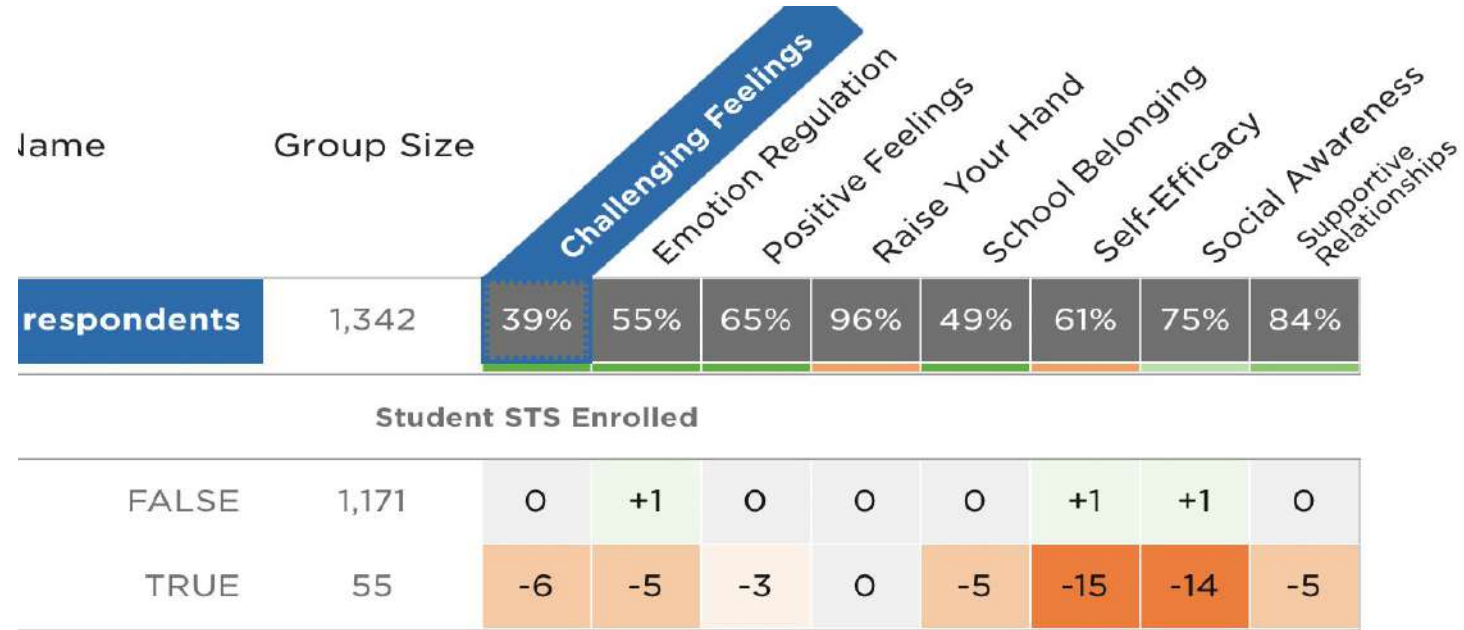
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STS Social Emotional Data (Panorama Survey)

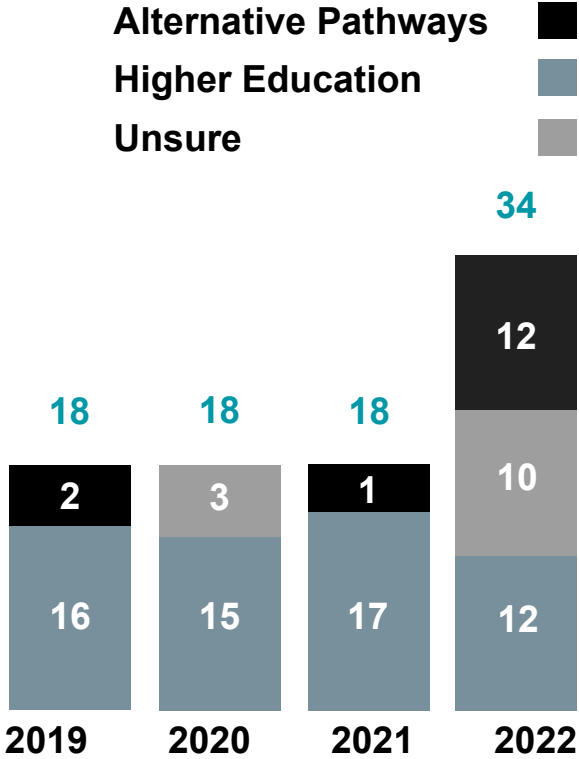
