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## **How to use Mme CHAN's website:**

Every night, you should go to my website and click on 6ème. Here are all the links that you will find there:

<u>6ème = 6e= sixième</u>, which is the equivalent of 6th grade in France! This is an important cultural point, since we may be corresponding with pen-pals our age in France. This is also the tab where you will find information about your homework and class-work, my grading policy, podcasts and pronunciation links as well as supplementary videos.

<u>6ème devoirs:</u> This link will give you your homework by day. Notice that I always include a summary about class, which I expect you to read every night before doing your homework. This will remind you what we did in class (and help those who were absent). This tab also includes quizzes and project due dates.

<u>6ème podcasts:</u> I will be making podcasts for you to practice what we have done in class. You should listen to these for 10 minutes per night, to really get the sound of the language in your ear. If these get too boring, then go to "Extra links for practice" and find something else that will be more engaging on the same subject!

<u>6ème: Correspondants:</u> If we get pen-pals this year, then this page will include your current pen-pals: information on their school and where they live. As we learn more about them, you will decide what content to add to this page. (What is currently here is what we did in 2010/2011). I encourage you to browse the pen-pal information from the past years, to get an idea of what we have learned through these exchanges. This can be found on the main page, under the link "Correspondants precedents".
