## Sixth Grade Happenings

#### **ELA**

Our students have completed the novel, *Missing Mike*. This novel was written by author, Shari Green. Currently, our students are reading the novel, *Small Spaces* by Katherine Arden. It is a great book to read around Halloween. Students are continuing to use *Words Their Way* to address the weaknesses found in spelling. They have weekly spelling lists that are based on their individual spelling levels. Assessments are conducted on Friday, and the students have a homework packet that needs to be completed prior to the

test. Students are using IXL to work on language skills. The students need to continue reading for at least 20 minutes a night. Reading is the best way to increase students' vocabulary.

#### Math

Sixth grade math is off to a strong start. Students are learning how to multiply and divide fractions. Math homework is assigned nightly. Students are assigned two math skills on IXL each week. The math skill is a concept on what has already been taught in the math class. Students must complete the IXL assignments by the end of the week. Please check with your child to see if homework is completed.

#### **Social Studies**

Sixth grade Social Studies is working on a large Ancient River
Civilizations unit. Students have reviewed and discussed the Neolithic
Revolution. We dove into the four Old-World River Valley Cultures: Egypt, Mesopotamia, India, and China.
We have located these ARC regions on the map, and investigated and explored their social structures,
governments, agriculture, economies, writing systems, buildings and religions, and enduring influences.
Students were to study these Ancient River Civilizations and the maps this week. There will be a test over the
material next week.

#### Science

Sixth grade science has gotten off to a great start. We have learned how to make observations and inferences and also how to identify variables in experiments. Currently, we are learning about cells. Specifically, we are studying the different parts of the cell and their functions. Hopefully, the next three grading periods go as well as the first!
