ELA

Our students have completed their Memoir/Biography Genre Study. Sixth grade students conducted biographical research on a person of their choice. They wrote a biographical essay about their subject. Students should continue reading for at least 20 minutes a night. Our students have finished their first novel, <code>Zlata's Diary</code>. The students enjoyed reading about the perspective of war through the eyes of an 11-year-old girl from Bosnia. Our students are currently reading a realistic fiction novel, <code>Hatchet</code> by Gary Paulson. It is a riveting survival story about Brian Robeson, a 13-year-old boy, who finds himself fending for himself in the wilderness after a plane crash. Students will go on to compare this novel with a nonfiction account of a teenage who survived a plane crash and her time in the Amazon Rainforest. Math

Math students are currently completing their chapter 2 math test. We have studied prime and composite numbers, prime factorization, and greatest common factor. We will be identifying parts of an expression and substituting. Remember the students have homework Monday through Thursday. Please make sure the students are completing their homework every night. Homework gives the students valuable practice time necessary to learn new skills.

Social Studies

We have been extremely busy during the start of our 2020-2021 school year. First we traveled through the ancient worlds of Mesopotamia, India, Egypt, and China before moving on to the Five Major World Religions of Hinduism, Buddhism, Judaism, Christianity, and Islam. After testing our knowledge of these belief systems, we will explore how these religions have impacted the modern countries that are now located where they got their start by researching and writing individual essays.

One word of note: IF your child is quarantined or absent for an extended time, he/she will still need to keep up with studies. Most of my classes start with a Google Meet that can be accessed from home. Students need to sign in at the start of their class time just as if they were in the room with me.
