Course Name: 6th Grade Reading

Grade Level: 6

Subject Area: English

Class Goals:

• To learn to read for pleasure

- To be able to use and reflect on reading strategies
- To gain new vocabulary that can be applied in reading and writing
- To be able to develop the ability to get meaning from texts
- Use word identification strategies appropriately and automatically when encountering new words

Novels:

Fiction and Nonfiction

We will read the novels "Freak the Mighty" (a novel that teaches about friendship, empathy, and equality.) "The City of Ember" (a novel that teaches about risk, fantasy, and science fiction), "The Truth About Truman" (a novel about cyberbullying and it's impacts), and "Surviving Hitler." (a nonfiction novel about a boy who survived the Holocaust). We will also do a unit lightly based on literature circles that will include the novels "Old Yeller", "Firegirl", "Mockingbird", and "Wildlife." These are all novels that include many life lessons about kindness, interacting with people that are different from us, and survival. We will read several nonfiction articles, and each student will be responsible for completing a book review each quarter on a book of his/her choice.

The standards that we will work towards with all of these novels are as follows:

Reading Literature and Informational Text
