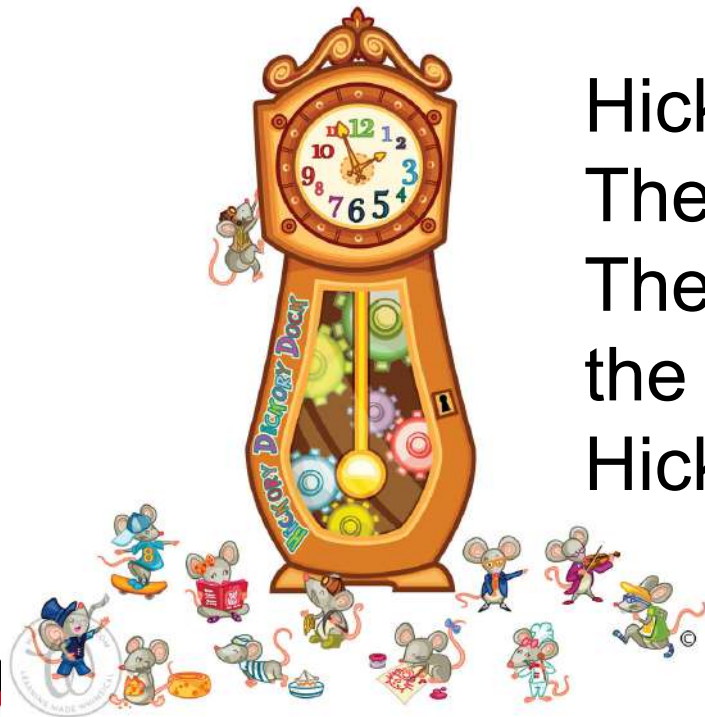


This tall clock is called a grandfather clock. These clocks make a sound like a ringing bell at different times of the day.

struck means to tell something with a sound. It was one o'clock, and the clock made one sound like this: "bong".

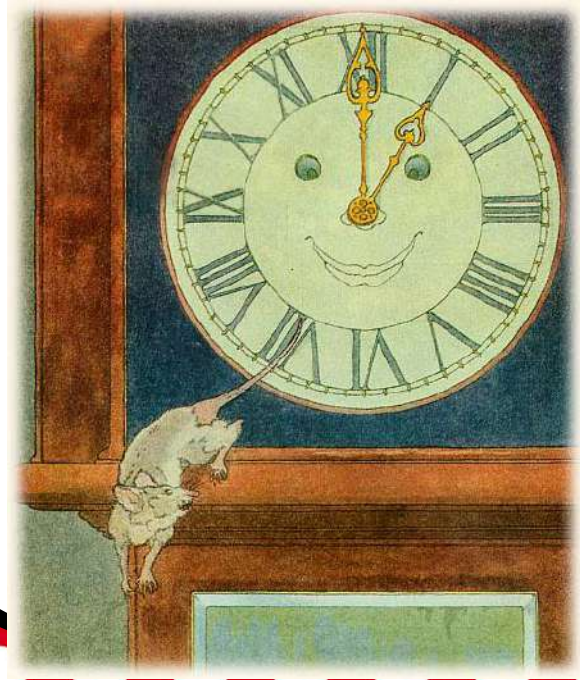

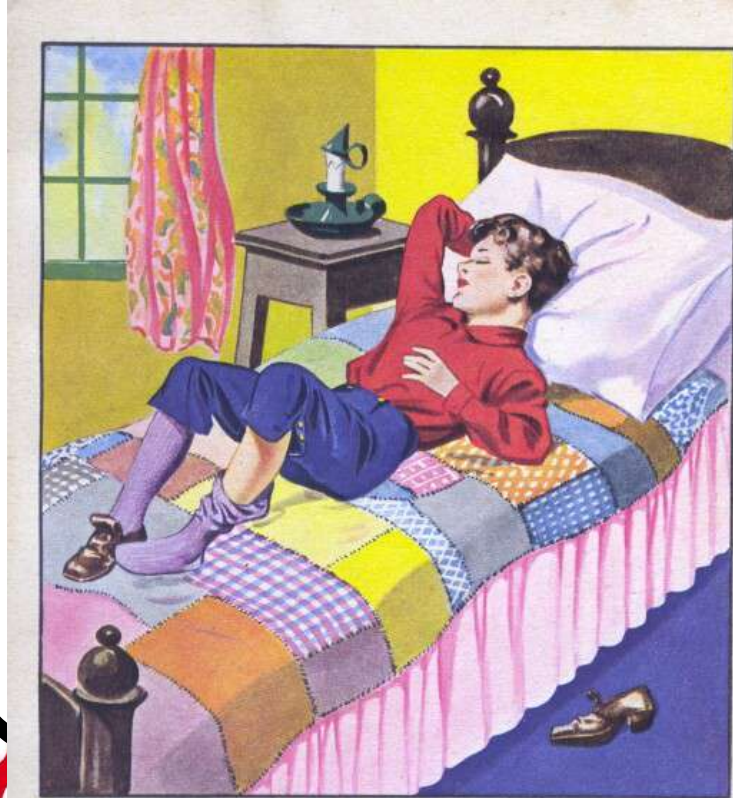


Diddle, Diddle, Dumpling
