



Location: Where is it?


- Absolute Location (Exact Location)
 - Precise, using coordinates. For example lines of longitude and latitude, or grid lines.

- Relative Location
 - The relationship of one place to other places. Uses words like: near, beside, under, next to, etc.
 - Relative location
 can shrink or
 expand with time.











Place: What is it like there?


- Physical Characteristics
 - Natural forming
 landforms. Things
 created without
 human aid.
 - Ex Landforms,
 bodies of water,
 climate, soils,
 animal life, and
 vegetation.

- Human
 Characteristics
 - Come from human ideas and actions that result in changes to the environment.
 - Ex. Buildings,
 farms, dams, and
 any human made
 structure.












What is the relationship between people and their surroundings (their environment?)

- 1. Humans Depend
 - All basic needs are met by our environment.
 For example: Food, water, and shelter.
- 2. Humans Modify
 - Humans change their environment to meet their needs.
- 3. Humans Adapt
 - Humans make changes in their behavior to meet their needs.














Movement: How do people in one area affect people in other areas?

- 1. Movement of People
 - Usually described as migration, which is moving to a new location for the purpose of settlement.
 - Forced- Slavery
 - Voluntary Settlement

2. Movement of Goods

- Examples: Trade goods, food items, raw materials (natural resources), and manufactured goods.
- 3. Movement of Ideas
 - Humans share/borrow ideas and knowledge with one another.











Region: What common features does a certain area share?

- Region is a basic unit of geography. They are areas that have some kind of unifying characteristic. These characteristics may be either physical or human made.
- Examples: Language, religion, and similar land characteristics.
