3 - **The week of April 6 through 10** we will be doing some Spanish cultural lessons. All 4 middle schools put these together. Each day has a different assignment that I’d like you to do if you want. The purpose of this is to wrap our heads back around the Spanish-speaking world and also to make sure we all know how to turn in work through google classroom. Each day is a different topic and I hope you’ll find the assignments interesting. Each of the assignments will be done in English - so don’t worry about that part. All assignments will be posted Monday morning.
