Grade 7 Journal Prompts

Write a one paragraph (5-10 sentence) response for each of the 10 prompts. You must answer the first 2 questions. You may choose the remaining 8 prompts.

- 1. Pretend you are one of the characters and explain how you would react to a conflict that the character is facing.
- 2. Choose a major event that happened in the book. Describe your feelings about it.
- 3. Copy down a quote from a character and explain why you think it's meaningful.
- 4. Pretend you are one of the characters and explain how you would react to a conflict that the character is facing.
- 5. Explain how a character has changed from beginning, middle, and end. Give 3 reasons.
- 6. Explain how this book relates to your life. Give 3 reasons.
- 7. What lesson/theme does the author try to teach through the plot and characters of this book? Give 3 examples to support your theme.
- 8. Write about a relationship between two characters. Explain why it is interesting/unique.

- 9. Explain the setting of the story and its impact on the story. Give 3 ways the setting impacts the story.
- 10. What kind of conflict is the main character facing? Is it character vs. character; character vs. self; character vs. society, character vs. nature; character vs. supernatural? Explain why you chose this type of conflict and provide 3 examples.
- 11. Describe a part of the book that is either realistic or unrealistic. Explain why using 3 reasons.
- 12. Who is your favorite character in your book? Why is this character your favorite?
- 13. Think about a setting in your book. If you were in the setting, what are some things you might see?
- 14. What point of view is your book written in? How do you know?
- 15. If you were in the story, what would your relationship be to the main character?
- 16. In what ways would this book be different if it were set 100 years in the past?
- 17. In what ways would this book be different if it was set 100 years in the future?
- 18. Think about a supporting character in your book. How would the book be different if that character did not exist?
- 19. Think of an important event in your book. How would the story have changed if this event had not happened?
- 20. What is the tone/mood of your book? How do you know?
- 21. If you could give the main character in your book some advice, what would you tell him or her?
- 22. If you could ask the main character of this book three questions, what would you ask?
- 23. Do you think the title fits the book? If you could change the title, what would you change it to and why?
- 24. Why do you think the author wrote this book? What was the author's purpose?
- 25. What are your thoughts on the ending of the book? If you could change the ending, how would you change it?
- 26. Would you recommend this book to a friend? Why or why not?
