

Seventh Grade Art is an introduction to a variety of different art mediums in a fun and energetic room where you get to work with your hands and imagination to create artwork unique to you! Heavy emphasis will be on learning how to use materials and tools properly (and experimenting with them), learning to notice and speak about art, and using the elements and principles in your art making! You will create Sharpie line drawings, junk food ceramics, Artist Trading Cards, Animal Up Close acrylic paintings, agamographs, pattern prints, food watercolor triptychs, and colored pencil selfies!
