

Social studies began the first nine weeks with an exciting field trip to a performance of the outdoor drama *Tecumseh!* Several eighth graders attended the show thanks to the Gallia-Vinton Educational Service Center. Students have discovered how geography, political situations, and social movements led to the founding of each colony. Using their knowledge of the colonies, the students will begin their look into the causes and events of the American move to independence in the next nine weeks.





## Science News

We have had such an exciting 1st 9 weeks at Wellston Middle School. Our Science class has been focusing on understanding the scientific method through experimentation. Our first lab covered the concept of osmosis through gummy bear saturation. We recently created our own density tubes while discussing Earth's internal make up. Students have completed multiple labs where we learned how to work through the scientific process, collaboration, data analysis as well as understanding that it is ok to be wrong about a hypothesis. Starting over is always an option.
