## **GRADING SCALE:**

90% - 100% = A (Mastery of Essential Learner Outcomes, no missing work)

80% - 89% = B (Good understanding of Essential Learner Outcomes, minimal missing/late assignments)

70% - 79% = C (Understand Essential Learner Outcomes, some missing/late assignments)

60% - 69% = D (Poor understanding of Essential Learner Outcomes, multiple missing/late assignments)

59% - below = F (Does not understand Essential Learner Outcomes, multiple missing/late assignments)

**All learning activities/homework must be turned in by the end of a unit**

Your final grade for each trimester will be based on these three categories:

### **Assessments (tests/quizzes/projects) (70% of your trimester grade)**

Quizzes will be given frequently to track students understanding of essential learning targets. Tests will be given at the end of each unit and will evaluate student performance for the learning targets for each specific unit. Opportunities will be given to retest on specific learning targets if proficiency is not met on unit tests. Projects are different forms of assessment that require extended class time to complete. We will do a variety of large and small projects throughout the year.

### **Learning activities/homework (20% of your trimester grade)**

Learning activities and homework include maps, mapping labs, notes, activities, group work, etc. If a student is absent, these assignments may need to be done as homework outside of class.
