GRADUATING WITH HONORS

Wentzville uses Cum Laude/Honor System

- Holt Graduation requirements **PLUS**:
- Math- need a total of 4 credits (at/above Algebra I)
- Additional Concentrated Core Electives -
(3.0 credits of additional Math, Science, English,
Social Studies, or World Language)
- GPA of at least a 3.0
- ACT Score at or above 21
- 1 High School activity (club/sport)
- Record of good citizenship



CUM LAUDE HONORS

All three levels require **first** earning **Academic Honors** and a record of good citizenship

Cum Laude

- 3.5 min GPA
- One credit from qualifying courses
- Two high school activities
- ACT comp of 22

Summa cum Laude

- 4.0 min GPA
- Three credits from qualifying courses
- Four high school activities
- ACT comp of 24

Magna cum Laude

- 3.75 min GPA
- Two credits from qualifying courses
- Three high school activities
- ACT comp of 23



MISSOURI A+ SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Students who complete the A+ Program during high school, will qualify for A+ Program Scholarship. The A+ Scholarship will pay the cost of tuition at any Missouri community college or public vocational school within the first four years after high school.

A+ Program Requirements:

- Maintain & graduate with a 2.5+ cumulative non-weighted GPA.
- Maintain & graduate with a 95% cumulative attendance rate.



A+ PROGRAM...

- Maintain a record of good citizenship and avoid the unlawful use of drugs and/or alcohol.
- Achieve a score of proficient or advanced on the Algebra I, II or Geometry End of Course Exam, or earn a 17+ ACT math sub-score.
- * Junior/Seniors must complete 50 hours of supervised tutoring with younger students in the WSD. Seniors can complete pre-approved job shadowing for up to 25% (12.5 hours) of this requirement.



COLLEGE ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

- Colleges and universities determine their own admission requirements!
- Make sure to check specific college websites for specific requirements.
- Typical 4 year colleges requirements: Core Classes are MOST important
 - 4 years of English
 - 4 years of Mathematics, Algebra 1 and higher
 - 3 years of Science & 3 Social Studies
 - 2 years of the same Foreign Language

COLLEGIATE SPORTS: ACADEMIC ELIGIBILITY

- NCAA Division I or II and NAIA colleges require specific academic requirements to participate at the college level.

*Criteria includes: CORE course work, CORE gpa and ACT Index scores

- **Communicate with your student's school counselor and high school coaches to make sure your student maintains MSHSAA high school eligibility and will reach NCAA or NAIA academic eligibility requirements.**

Consider your Career Path

- Taking rigorous courses prepares students for the ACT test, and for college-level course work
- Think ahead to all 4 years
- Whatever your plans are, you need to be eligible, be prepared

and be proactive!



CORE CLASSES AND RECOMMENDATIONS

- General standard English, Math, Science, SS and PE/Health will already be listed.
- Algebra Strategies/Reading Enrichment may also be recommended (Summer School PE/Health allows for an elective)
- Descriptions in Course Guide.
- 8th grade teachers will be conferencing with students regarding course recommendations.
- If you have a concern regarding a recommended course, please contact your 8th grade teachers. They will help you.
- Case managers will be recommending core courses for students with IEP's.



- All WMS students will be registering online via student portal (if you do not have internet access, you will be able to obtain assistance at the middle school).
- If you are taking PE/Health over summer school and an enrollment form is turned in then we will delete it on your schedule request and add your 1st alternate choice.
- Counselors *may* make necessary adjustments to your requests after you have submitted them due to missing prerequisites, cancelled courses or overfilled courses, etc.

STUDENTS Policy 2651

Discipline - Student Dress

The Board expects student dress and grooming to be neat, clean and of good taste so that each student may share in promoting a positive, healthy and safe atmosphere within the school. The dress code creates in students a renewed sense of seriousness regarding school and school activities and should be followed on campus, at school activities and on school buses. The Board may require students to wear a school uniform. Its purpose is to emphasize that school is the student's place of work and that respect for other members of society and oneself places some restrictions on the nature of dress and grooming.

It is a mark of maturity when students can freely choose apparel that demonstrates individuality without deviating from the standard of appropriateness. Student dress and grooming will be the responsibility of the individual and his/her parents within the following guidelines:



5. Hats, caps, bandanas, hoods, dew rags, wave caps, or other non-therapeutic headgear are not to be worn in the school building. These items also may not be displayed hanging from belt, waistband or pocket.

6. Students shall not wear clothing or accessories bearing the following messages:

- a. Obscene or profane statements or pictures;
- b. Statements advocating immoral, illegal, sexual or violent behavior;
- c. Statements advertising, promoting or picturing alcohol, tobacco or drugs;
- d. Language or symbolism (including, but not limited to, swastikas, rebel flags, the occult or gang affiliation.)

7. Students shall not wear clothing that shows any of the following:

- a. Boxers/Briefs/Underwear
- b. Bras
- c. Back
- d. Belly/Stomach/Midriff
- e. Backside/Butt/Bottom
- f. Breast/Chest
- g. Bare/Nearly Bare Shoulders
