Graduation Requirements

- 4 years of English
- 3 years of Science:
 - ☐ Physics, Chemistry, & Biology
- 3 years of History:
 - ☐ US History I, US History II, World History
- ☐ 2 years of World Languages (consecutive) Students must choose two World Language options. (one is an alternate)
- □ 1 year of Health/Physical Education for each year enrolled
- 3 years of Mathematics
 - Algebra I, Algebra II, Geometry, PreCalculus, etc.

Required Courses for 9th Graders

- English I or English I Honors
- ☐ US History I or US I Honors
- ☐ Physics, Physics Honors, or AP Physics 1 (Based upon Math placement)
- ☐ Health & PE I
- ☐ World Language
- ☐ Math Course Based upon current placement
- ☐ Elective Courses Your choice

9th Grade Mathematics Placement Requirements

□ *Algebra 1 (5 credits) Prerequisites:

Current Algebra 8, Part 1 assessment average of 74 or less

All current Math 8 students

□ *Algebra 1, Part 2 (5 credits) Prerequisites:

Current Algebra 8, Part 1 assessment average of 75 or more

Current Algebra 8 assessment average of 74 or less

^{*}A passing Algebra 1 NJSLA score is a NJ High School Graduation Requirement.

^{*}We will offer a math support class named Math Lab 9 (5 credits) for students in Algebra 1 and Algebra 1, Part 2 that demonstrate need.

9th Grade Mathematics Placement Requirements

□ Geometry Prerequisite:

Current Algebra II Honors Assessment Average 84% or less

□ Geometry Honors* Prerequisite:

Current Algebra II Honors Assessment Average of 85% or higher

*Students placed in Geometry Honors have the option of choosing AP Physics 1 for their science placement.

Option: Doubling Up in Honors Math

- □ 8th graders currently in Algebra I Accelerated with an "A+" average have the option to take both Geometry Honors and Algebra II Honors at the same time next year.
- ☐ Sequence of Math:
 - 9th Grade: Algebra II Honors & Geometry Honors
 - 10th Grade: Pre-calculus Honors
 - 11th Grade: Calculus Honors, AP Calculus AB, or AP Calculus BC
 - 12th Grade: AP Statistics or Multivariable Calculus






AP Physics 1 Prerequisite

□ We currently have 20 ninth graders enrolled in AP Physics 1 for this year





New Jersey Student Learning Assessment "NJSLA" Graduation Requirement Class of 2023 (9th Grade) and Beyond

As of July 30, 2019, we have not received any new graduation information from the NJ Department of Education. We are acting on the information we currently have. We will notify you of any new information as we receive it.

The first pathway to demonstrate proficiency is as follows:

- For the class of 2023 and beyond, students must **pass NJSLA ELA 10** in order to satisfy the graduation requirement for ELA.
- For math, students must **pass NJSLA Algebra 1** in order to satisfy the graduation requirement for Math.
- ☐ This graduation requirement includes middle school students who take Algebra 1 in 7th or 8th grade.
- *This may change as the NJDOE has not officially approved graduation requirements for the Class of 2023 and beyond.

NJSLA Graduation Requirement Class of 2023 (9th Grade) and Beyond

- ☐ If students do not pass NJSLA ELA 10 or Algebra 1:
 - Students can demonstrate proficiency through a **2nd Pathway** or passing with an alternate assessment.
 - If students do not pass the first or second pathway, there is a 3rd Pathway: students will have to submit a NJDOE portfolio appeal.
 - Supports are in place for students that may need this option:
 - English Lab
 - ☐ Math Lab 12

Honors Criteria

 - Teacher Recommendation
 - □ Collaboration with 8th grade teachers

What is an AP course?

- \square AP = Advanced Placement
- ☐ AP Physics 1 is the only AP offered to a 9th grader. Students are required to have Algebra 2 Honors completed prior to enrolling
- □ No more than 3 AP Courses per year
- Expectations
 - Viewed as a college course
 - Summer assignments
 - Large amount of independent study
 - Examination given through College Board in May

Honors Appeals Process

- Waiver Form for Honors Courses
 - Overall Academic Performance including 3rd & 4th marking period grades
 - Standardized Test Scores
 - Teacher Recommendation
 - Attendance/Discipline Record
 - Waiver Forms will be available at your meeting
 - Waiver Forms must be submitted to the RHS
 Counseling Department

The RHS teachers will let your school counselor know what Spanish course best fits your needs. A written assessment will be conducted as well. Your 8th grade Spanish teachers will let you know your Spanish course level for next year.

■ 8th Graders New to District:

This summer, RHS Spanish teachers will assess students who wish to continue with Spanish as their world language choice. If the student has not taken any Spanish courses, they will be placed into Spanish I.




- ☐ Career/College Search Database for Robbinsville School District

- Link to Naviance Student can be found on the main page of the Pond Road website and also on the RHS website. Your login information will remain the same at RHS. New students to district will obtain their Naviance Student login at your course selection meeting.











Attendance Procedures

The Board of Education requires that the pupils enrolled in the school district attend school regularly in accordance with the laws of the state.

Robbinsville High School reinforces the attendance policy.

Full Year Courses: Maximum of 8 unexcused absences per course
Half Year/Semester Courses: Maximum of 4 unexcused absences per course
Three Unexcused Tardies to a course = 1 Unexcused Absence for that course

Attendance is taken by course not by date. If students go over the allotted days, they will lose credit from their courses even if they have a passing grade. The attendance office will send warning letters home. Attendance hearings are held monthly with an Attendance Committee.

Organizational Tips

- Get an A-Day & B-Day Book Bag
- Do your homework on the same day it is given
 - A-Day: Do A-Day Homework
 - B-Day: Do B-Day Homework
- ☐ Teachers are in the classroom from 2:05pm − 2:35pm every day to assist students

Safety/Security Protocols

- All students, faculty, staff are required to wear their ID cards at all times.
 - It is a \$5.00 to purchase a new ID if you lose one.
- Clear bag for PE clothing (Bags can be purchased in the Main Office for \$5.00)
- ☐ Students may carry a clear pencil case.
- \square Students may carry 8.5x5.5 small purse/bag throughout the day.
- ☐ Students may bring their book bag to school, but they must immediately be stored in the school assigned locker.
- Books, notebooks, electronic devices, and water bottles may be carried throughout the day.

New Student Orientation

- □ New Student Orientation is highly encouraged.
- Students will receive their homeroom, locker number/combination & print out of their schedule.
- □ Wednesday, September 2nd is New Student Orientation. The time is 7:30am 9:00am.
- ☐ Thursday, September 3rd is the first day of school.
- ☐ Students will receive bus transportation to/from orientation if they are slated to receive it throughout the school year.
