This exploratory course will introduce the student artist to a wide variety of art experiences. The materials and processes will be experienced through drawing, painting, printmaking, mixed media, clay and sculpture techniques.

Beginning Studio Art: 2-D Design & Beginning Digital

Prerequisite: None

This exciting design based course will introduce the student artist to a wide variety of materials and processes experienced through drawing, painting, printmaking and mixed media. Students will then progress to work in digital drawing using iPads. Design skills learned in this course will assist students in preparation for a variety of art professions or any design related field. Good composition and an understanding of the elements and principles of design are stressed as necessary for creating a successful art product.

Beginning Drawing and Painting	AR211	Elective	1/2 credit	D, N, S	Grade 9-12

Prerequisite: None

This introductory course is for students who love to draw and would like to improve. Students develop observational skills and learn basic drawing and painting techniques such as shading and blending using a variety of media. Students create realistic and abstract drawings and paintings in this class by applying different techniques through guided and independent practice.

Subject matter may include: still life, portraiture, landscape, fantasy, and abstract drawing.

Beginning Clay and Sculpture: 3-D Design AR217 Elective 1/2 credit D, N, S
--

Prerequisite: None

This is an introductory course covering a wide range of clay pottery and sculpture techniques. Individual development is encouraged and a wide variety of methods will be explored including glazing and other finishing techniques. Students will have the opportunity to work on the potter's wheel.

Intermediate Studio Art: 2-D Design	AR202	Elective	1/2 credit	D, N, S	Grade 9-12

Prerequisite: AR201 or AR211

This studio design course seeks to challenge the student with creative thinking and artistic problem solving assignments. A variety of materials, media and processes will be introduced and projects will focus on good craftsmanship and composition. Students will learn about contemporary design in today's culture, presentation methods and will be encouraged to enter exhibitions. An opportunity will be provided for deeper exploration in media such as: drawing, painting, printmaking, digital drawing, and mixed media.

- Regular sequencing: Physical Science in 9th grade
- If you have <u>completed Geometry</u> and are <u>offered a spot</u> in Biology rather than taking Physical Science, you should consider this option only if:
 - you are <u>passionate</u> about science and math
 - you are interested in entering a science related career field

**You need to be fully aware you will need to take one year of Chemistry and one year of Physics to meet the standards for graduation if you do not take Physical Science. If this is something you are considering, we highly encourage you to speak to someone in the Science Department during the course fair or via phone or email.


