## Course Outline

Welcome to Geography. This semester we will be studying chapters 1-15. This will cover the continents of North America, South America, and Europe. At the end of each chapter will be a test.

This class is more than book learning. As well as reading every day, you will be working on the Internet, applying art skills and public speaking skills.

Each of you will be responsible for at least one country in each continent we study. Sometimes you may have two. You will be required to make a map, flag and report on your country. You will be graded on each of these three areas of your presentation. The presentation itself is worth thirty points with each of the three areas equaling ten points each.

This is also a cooking class. Students will make a food native to their country they are studying. For example, if your country is Mexico you can make burritos.

In addition to the classroom presentations you will also be required to complete map work for every area we study. You will complete two maps per unit. One map will be of the physical characteristics of a continent and the other will be the political map of the continent.

Every Friday is current event day. You will be required to bring one current event every Friday. When we start talking about areas of the world (i.e. Europe, Asia) you will be required to bring a current event of the country that you are assigned in that area. If you cannot find a current event on your country you will bring a current event on another country in that region.

## Classroom Rules (My favorite part):

- 1. Never speak out of turn.
