Instructions: This summer students will be choosing a text from the "Grade Level and Genre Unit Chart" below. Students must also complete one of the note taking methods listed below for the choice text. <u>The choice text will be assessed during the first class sessions and will be worth 10% of the first quarter grade</u>. Advanced Placement Language and Composition and Advanced Placement Literature and Composition students are expected to complete the separate coursework (linked below). <u>Advanced Placement English Language and Composition</u>

Advanced Placement English Literature and Composition

- 1. For Everyone by Jason Reynolds
- 2. The questions below are related to *For Everyone*. These questions will be discussed in the PEI session in September:
 - a. Are there times when you might feel foolish in pursuit of your goals? How does this relate to the idea of Accomplishment in PERMA to "pursue bigger and future goals"? How do you "push yourself to reach new boundaries"?
 - b. What do you think is the "oppressive part of you of everyone"? How do we deal with that self-oppression when we are trying to reach our goals? How do we overcome that part of us?
 - c. Why does he turn his message about dreaming from the trials and tribulations of having dreams to the message of courage starting on p. 62? How does dreaming take courage?
 - d. Reynolds writes, "THIS LETTER IS FOR US ALL, to remind us that we are many. That we are right for trying. That purpose is real. That making it is possible." How do these lines inspire you? How do you dream big and make a plan to make that dream happen?
 - e. Reynolds closes his piece with a letter. How would you respond in a letter back to the author?

- 4. CHOOSE ONE of the following methods for your choice text.
 - a. <u>Double Entry Notes</u> / <u>(template here)</u>
 - b. Annotating

- c. Stop-and-Jots on Post-Its
- d. Notice and Note
- e. <u>Personal Journal Responses</u>

All text selections will be <u>teacher-approved</u> during a Spring 2020 reading conference. **Students moving** into Robbinsville over the summer will have to choose one of the texts listed below.
