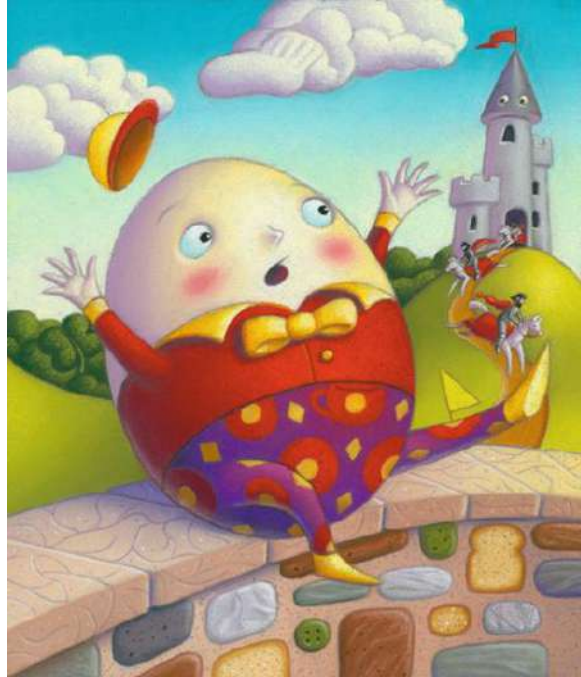

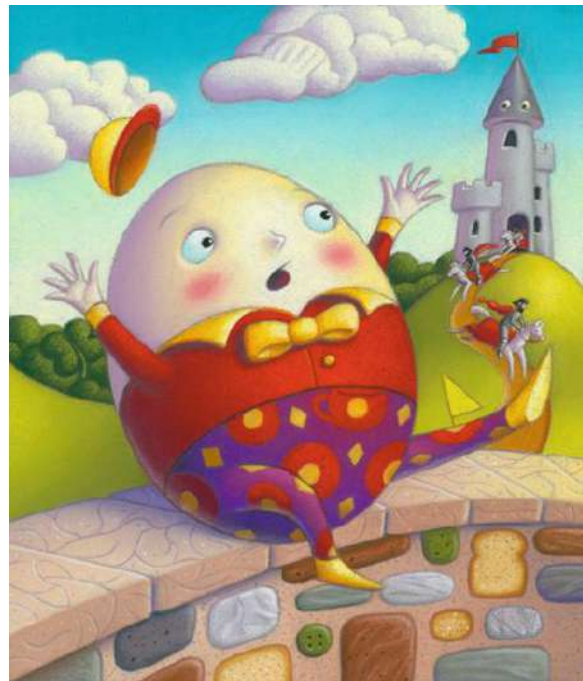

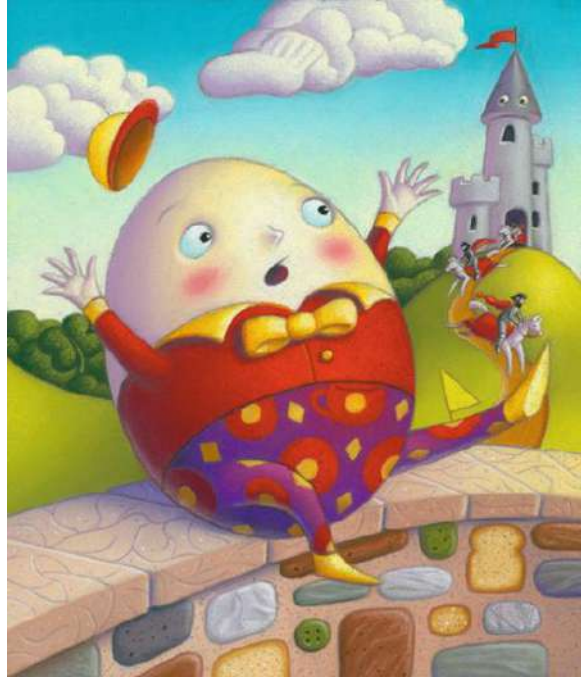
What do you see in this picture? What might happen in the nursery rhyme?

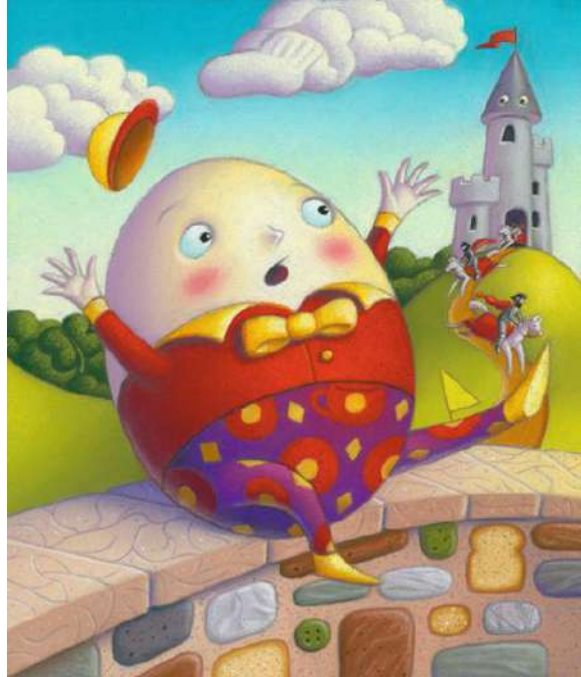
