



CAREER & COLLEGE PROMISE

- Rising Juniors & Seniors
 - Must meet certain GPA and test score requirements
- College transfer and career pathways. Make sure the courses are transferable
- Take college courses online or at the college through South Piedmont Community College
- Check CCP course to determine if it earns College Prep, Honors, or AP high school credit for gpa
- Interested students need to complete google doc link emailed and on pirate press

ACADEMIC DIFFICULTY OF COURSES

- College Prep (CP) Standard level courses to prepare for college.
- Honors (HN) These courses demand greater independence and contain more challenging material than College Prep Level courses.
- Advanced Placement (AP) Course content, pace, and academic rigor are college-level as adopted by the College Board and prepare students to take the AP examinations which may lead to college credit. This course requires the highest level of independence.

TEACHER RECOMMENDATIONS


- Teachers make recommendations based on the students progress in the previous or related course. The teacher is recommending the course where they feel you can be challenged AND successful.

Registration Timeline

- March 6th- March 14th- Students enter course selections into PowerSchool through student account
- March 14th- Due date for all course requests to be submitted online, registration form due to 2nd block teacher
