Credits Needed for Graduation

- 4 English
- 4 Math (including Alg. 2)
- 3 Social Studies
- 3 Science (Biology, physical, other)
- .5 credits health, .5 credits PE or 2 waivers, 1 fine art (or 2 sem. at the middle school), 4 credits electives = 20 credits total

You are the number one person responsible when making your schedule




Earning Credits

- To be promoted to 10th grade earn at least 5 credits (in student handbook online p. 32)
- A credit is earned by passing a full year class or two semester classes
- Once a credit is earned, you will not lose it
- Have to repeat any required class you do NOT pass



GPA – Grade Point Average

- Cumulative beginning in 9th grade
 - Calculated using semester grades (see online handbook p. 31)
 - Primary consideration for colleges
 - Work hard during 9th grade
 - Poor grades in 9th are hard to overcome




Homework is Important!

- Check your ProgressBook regularly. See your counselor for login help.




Extra-Curricular and Co-Curricular Eligibility

New Graduation Requirements for class of 2025


- 1) Get your 20 credits






Tutoring Help Available
