LANGUAGE ARTS JUNIOR HIGH: ACADEMIC READING (9th)

Academic Reading Placement in this course is on the basis of staff recommendation. The course is designed to be just one semester long for 9th graders. The program includes the use of READ 180. READ 180 is a researched-based reading intervention program designed to address their individual needs of striving adolescent readers using customized instructional software, high-interest fiction and non-fiction, and a systematic direct instruction in reading skills, vocabulary, writing, and grammar.
