# **Credit Requirements**

One of the biggest differences between Middle School and High School is the introduction of the transcript. The transcript is a record of all high school courses taken and the grades received. This is the beginning of accumulating credits toward graduation. If a student fails a required class, it needs to be retaken. The following credits are what your student needs for graduation:

# **Graduation Policy**

Students must have all 24 credits, including the specific credits listed above, in order to graduate and walk through commencement services.

### **Attendance**

Successful students attend school on a regular basis. Most student learning takes place within the school day. Therefore, when a student misses it is difficult to catch up and is compounded when they miss multiple days. While we know that some absences are inevitable, please take this into consideration before excusing your student for nonmedical reasons.

If your child is going to be absent, parents must call the school.

There is a 24 hour automated attendance line. That number is 354-1417.

**Policy**: a student may not receive credit for any class in which he/she accumulates more than 12 absences for one semester.

### **Absences**

In the event that your son or daughter is absent, they will be responsible for making up all assignments and/or tests that they missed. It is the student's responsibility to check with the teacher when they return to find out what information and assignments they missed. If a student is absent 2 or more days, parents may request that homework be collected. Parents would need to pick up all collected homework. Students are encouraged to speak with their teacher before any known absences.

# **Technology Policy**

All technical devices may be used between classes, during lunch and before and after school. It is the expectation that students will not use any device during class time.

### **Dress Code**

Students may not wear anything that has derogatory words, messages or pictures on it. Clothing may not advertise alcohol, tobacco and drugs. Clothing must cover midriff, chest and buttocks when seated or standing. Clothing must cover undergarments.

# Eligibility

While we advocate for students to participate in extra-curricular activities, their first priority is school and making progress towards graduation. Student grades will be reported every midterm and at the end of every quarter. If a student has one or more "F's" at mid-term, they will not be able to participate in activities until all grades are at a pass. If a student has one or more "F's" at the end of a quarter, he/she will be ineligible to participate in competition until the following mid-quarter.

# What do I do if my student is struggling or failing a class?

- Call your child's teacher. They can tell you why your child is failing and how they can improve.
   One option would be to schedule time before or after school for your student to get individual help.
- 2. Parent Portal
- 3. Lunch Study Hall
- 4. Homework Club
- 5. Make school a priority with your child
- 6. Talk with your child about school
  - Ask how their day went
  - Ask if they have homework (9<sup>th</sup> grade students typically have homework every night)
  - Check their planner/encourage planner use
  - If they have missing assignments according to Parent Portal, ask them about it
  - Help them prioritize their assignments/projects
  - Quiz them on an upcoming test
  - Help them organize
  - Help them learn study skills

### **Parent Portal**

Parent Portal is a tool that parents can utilize to view their child's grades, assignment completion, attendance, and lunch information. The high school does not use the ICU program that the Middle School uses. Parents will not be notified each time their student does not complete an assignment. As a result, Parent Portal can be an essential tool to help

### **Homework Club**

Homework Club is available to all students on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3:20-4:15. Miss Kummrow, Student Success Coordinator, oversees this program. National Honor Society students also attend to help tutor students. Students can receive help in all subject areas.

# **Lunch Study Hall**

Students will be assigned and required to attend a lunch study hall if they are failing core classes. The purpose of this study hall is to give students a time to check in and prioritize the work they need to complete. This study hall gives students 30 minutes of work time during the day to focus on missing work and to set goals towards passing each class. Please note that lunch study hall does not provide enough time for a student to complete all required work.

# **Study Skills for Students**

### Stay organized

- Use a planner to keep track of assignments and due dates
- o Come to class prepared- bring a pencil, notebook and book
- Use a separate folder and notebook in each class (color coding is one option, for example, Science is green, English is blue, etc.)

### Studying for tests

- Tests are usually announced several days prior to the test date. Students should study a little bit each day building up to the test day.
- Create flash cards
- o Ask a family member to quiz student
- Attend test day study sessions if available
- o Fill out review sheets if available
- Ask teachers to clarify anything not understood throughout the unit

Working on projects or assignments

- o Follow timeline if given
- o Break large projects into smaller pieces
- o Follow the directions carefully and meet specifics of an assignment

### In general

- Hand in everything on time (some teachers do not accept late assignments or only give partial credit)
- o Focus on teacher and class discussion
- o Have a designated spot for homework
- o Limit distractions when doing homework
- o Manage time

# **Activities Registration**
