IB Program: 9th Grade Registration Guidelines 2015-2016

To be read with the IB Four Year Plan

If you see "required" next to a course below, then place an X beside it on your registration card!

(1) English I IBMYP (on front side of registration card) It's Required

(2) (a) French II IBMYP or French III IBMYP (immersion only) or

- (b) German II IBMYP or German III IBMYP (immersion only) or
- (c) Spanish II IBMYP or Spanish III IBMYP (immersion only) or
- (d) Latin II or Latin III Honors

One of the **above** foreign languages is required. Listed on **front side** of the registration card under **World Languages** If you didn't complete one full year (1 HS credit) of French, German, Spanish, or Latin in middle school, you will need to take French I, German I, Spanish I, or Latin I 1st semester and French II IBMYP, German II IBMYP, Spanish II IBMYP, or Latin II (we don't offer a separate IBMYP Latin courses) 2nd semester. You will have to give up an elective! You must complete level III French, German, Spanish, or Latin by the end of 10th grade. You may be able to take level II and III of one of the required foreign languages in 10th grade. However, it is wiser to complete level II in 9th grade. To begin the three-year IB Higher Level foreign language track in 10th grade, you must complete level III in 9th grade!

(3) World History IBMYP (on front side of the registration card under Social Studies) It's Required

(4) Biology IBMYP (on front side of the registration card under Science). It's Required

(5) Math is on the **front side** of the registration card under **Mathematics. It's Required.** Please consult the IB Four Year Plan and Guidelines for Choosing an IB Math for the Diploma (both on MPHS website) to view the IB math options! You **must complete** Common Core Math III IBMYP in **10th grade** to enter the IB Diploma Program! You **must complete** Common Core Math III IBMYP in **9th grade** to begin the three-year Higher Level Math track. In **addition to** Common Core Math III IBMYP, Pre-Calculus is also highly recommended for the Higher Level Math track.

(6) Earth/Environmental Science IBMYP (on **front side** of the registration card under **Science**) **It's Required**. However, you do have **two additional options** to meet the **requirement**:

Option 1 Complete AP Environmental Science (11th or 12th). It's a one-year course or

Option 2 Complete IB Environmental Systems and Societies SL I & II (11th & 12th). It's a two-year course!

(7) Health/PE IBMYP (on back side of registration card) It's Required

(8) Electives are on the **back side** of the registration card in various places. You may take <u>any</u> elective on the 9th grade registration card, IBMYP or non IBMYP. However, if you are interested in taking IB Art or IB Photo in grades 11 & 12, take Art IBMYP (listed under **Visual Arts**). If you are interested in taking IB Theatre in grades 11 & 12, take Drama IBMYP (listed under **Performing Arts**). They are A/B courses that you can pair with Health/PE IBMYP.

You may complete a course in one term (4x4) or one year (Aday/Bday). **They must balance.** If you take an Aday/Bday course, you must take another Aday/Bday course. If you take a 4x4 course, you must take another 4x4 course.

9th graders must complete **35 hours** of community service. You may count **15 hours** for summer community service toward the 35 hours. You will document summer community service **online** in August when school is in session.
