

- To fulfill Science requirement for graduation, you must take Physics, Chemistry & Biology
- To fulfill Math requirement, you must complete 6 credits of math and at minimum complete FST or Accelerated Alg 2

English



★ Graduation Requirement: 8 credits

Classes: English 10 OR Accelerated English 10

English 10 (2 quarters / 2 credits)

Accelerated English 10 (2 quarters / 3 credits)

- Curriculum includes 10th and 11th grade English standards
- Students who are currently in an accelerated track will automatically be placed into accelerated classes in that track (unless they select out)

Social Studies - US History



★ Graduation Requirement: 8 credits

Classes: Modern U.S. History <u>OR</u> AP U.S. History

Modern US History - (2 quarters / 2 credits)

AP US History - (3 quarters / 3 credits)

• AP (Advanced Placement): College level course, offered with opportunity to earn college credit by passing an exam in the Spring (must score 3 or higher). AP is a weighted GPA course.

Science - Chemistry



★ Graduation Requirement: 6 credits

Classes: Chemistry OR AP Chemistry

Chemistry - (2 quarters / 2 credits)

AP Chemistry - (3 quarters / 3 credits)

 AP (Advanced Placement): College level course, offered with opportunity to earn college credit by passing an exam in the Spring (must score 3 or higher). AP is a weighted GPA course. Students earning a C- or better earn more grade points than a regular!

Math




★ Graduation Requirement: 6 credits

(2 quarters / 2 credits)

Based on the math course you are currently in, you will be able to take one of the following:

- Geometry
 - If you did not pass or did not take Geometry in 9th grade
- <u>Algebra 2</u> if you passed Geometry
- <u>Accelerated Algebra 2</u> combines Alg 2 and Functions, Stats, Trigonometry (FST), must have passed Geometry
- <u>Functions</u>, <u>Stats</u>, <u>Trigonometry</u> (<u>FST</u>) if you passed Algebra 2
- Pre-Calculus if you passed FST or Accelerated Alg 2

Physical Education



★ Graduation Requirement: 2 credits

9th grade (1 quarter / 1 credit)

- Intro to Sport Performance or Fit for Life
- 10-12th grade (1 quarter / 1 credit)
 - Adv. Sport Performance or Adv. Fit for Life

^{*}Please be sure you register for PE courses that will fulfill graduation requirements.

Health: Healthy Lifestyles



★ Graduation Requirement: 1 credit

Healthy Lifestyles (1 quarter / 1 credit)

 Other Health Science electives <u>DO NOT</u> meet the graduation requirement for Health

MUST take between 10-12th grade

Financial Literacy - Coming Fall of 2020!



- ★ This class will be REQUIRED for graduation
- ★ This class will cover personal money management, savings, and investment strategies and can be taken 11th or 12th grade
- ★ Personal Finance: DOES NOT meet the graduation requirement
- ★ It is recommended students in the class of 2022 do not take Personal Finance OR understand they would still need to take Financial Literacy before graduation IN ADDITION to Personal Finance

- > RECOMMENDED 2+ years for 4-year college
- Options:
 - Japanese 1, 2, or 3
 - German 1, 2, 3, 4, or CIS
 - Spanish 1, 2, 3, 4, or CIS
 - Spanish 2 teacher will be speaking in Spanish
 - Spanish for Spanish Speakers (SSS): speak with your Spanish teacher for placement recommendations!




Electives

- ★ Graduation Requirement: 16 credits
- > Explore courses in multiple Academies
- > Ask upperclassmen & teachers about course options
- Choose courses that are valuable and interesting to YOU
- > Read about the courses in the registration guide

Credit Recovery

- ★ Meet with your counselor to make a plan!
- If you have failed a required course, you can recover your credit/s in the following ways:
 - <u>Credit Recovery/APEX:</u> see your counselor to fill out a form and get on the waiting list to recover the credit this school year. Meets after school M-Th. You may/may not get in this school year.
 - <u>Summer School:</u> you can recover two credits during this time. You will get more information toward the end of the year.
 - In Your Schedule: register for the class you failed for next year to recover the credit. Be sure you can make it to 50 credits though!

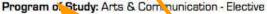

Understanding your Registration Guide

Interior Design

Grade Level: 9.10.11.12 Credits: SHS: 1 Credit. Prerequisite: None



Description: When you walk into a room, do you imagine a new design? Do you want to re-create the space in your own way? In Interior Design I, you will learn the basis of designing spaces for the interior and exterior of homes. This course will emphasize designing and drawing floor plans, types of furniture and furniture layout, window treatments, wall coverings, the history of housing, and the elements and principles of design. These skills will guide students to creatively and knowledgeably design rooms. Students will create floor plans and presentation boards that reflect their creativity as an interior designer.

Grade Level: 11.12 Credits: SHS: 2 Credits

Description: This class is designed for students who are seriously interested in the practical experience of art and want to focus on medium For this course, in lieu of an AP exam, students will submit a portfolio of work to the College Board for pretential college credit.

The AF Program offers three portfolios: Frawing, 2-D Design, and 3-D Design. The portfolios share a basic, three-section structure, which requires the student to show a fundamental competence and range of understanding in visual concerns (and methods). It is recommended that some students provide their own materials for their medium.






