|                          | <p><u>Understandings</u></p> <p><i>Students will understand that...</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● property of exponents extend to rational exponents</li> <li>● learn that a number is a <i>square root</i> of <math>c</math> if it squares to make <math>c</math> and square roots of <math>c</math> are solutions to the equation <math>x^2 = c</math></li> <li>● the positive square root is given the symbol <math>\sqrt{\phantom{x}}</math>, so the positive square root of <math>c</math> is written <math>\sqrt{c}</math> and the negative square root is written <math>-\sqrt{c}</math>.</li> <li>● squaring each side of an equation can sometimes introduce new solutions that aren't solutions to the original equation</li> <li>● the <math>\sqrt{-1}</math> can be rewritten using the notation <math>i</math> and that negative real numbers also have two square roots, one on the positive imaginary axis, and one on the negative imaginary axis.</li> <li>● that <math>i^2 = -1</math> and can use the commutative, associative, and distributive properties to add, subtract, and multiply</li> </ul> | <p><u>Essential Questions</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● How can we use advanced algebraic techniques to model and solve real-world problems?</li> <li>● What are the properties and applications of functions, including rational functions?</li> <li>● What are the properties and applications of complex numbers, and how can we use them to solve equations and represent geometric figures?</li> <li>● How do you add, subtract, multiply and divide complex numbers?</li> <li>● How is the process of completing the square used to solve a quadratic function and write it.</li> </ul> |
