VISITOR POLICY

Lowell Public School Policy states all outside visitors must report to the main office and sign in and out. SCHOOL INFORMATION

HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY (HSE) TESTING INFORMATION

Massachusetts residents, who desire to earn a High School Equivalency credential, have the option of passing two tests: the HiSET or the GED. **Candidates can choose to take all subject tests in one exam, or combine passing tests from both.** The exams are comparable in terms of passing rates and complexity, but they do vary in some ways. For example, the GED is only computer based, but the HiSET can be taken on a computer or on paper.

Abisi Adult Education is an official Test Center for both exams. Candidates schedule their tests through their accounts at Hiset.org and/or Ged.com. The Commonwealth of Massachusetts has provided voucher codes for free testing. At checkout, use one of the following codes:

CITIZENSHIP CORNER

Should I Consider U.S. Citizenship?

A lawful permanent resident, or Green Card holder, must meet certain eligibility requirements to become a U.S. citizen. Once these requirements are met, he or she may file the Form N-400, Application for Naturalization, with U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS).

The total cost to apply for citizenship is \$725 (\$640 filing fee plus the \$85 biometric fee).

One question that students often ask is: "Should I start to study for the citizenship interview and test before or after I file my N-400? Many permanent residents prefer to begin to study **before** they fill out and submit the Form N-400.

USCIS notes that the naturalization interview and test consist of two parts:

The English Test, which is determined by the applicant's ability to read, write, speak and understand English; **and**

The Civics (U.S. history and government) Test

With so much to study, where should you begin?

A great place to start is online at USCIS. USCIS has a **Citizenship Resource Center**, which provides **free** information and resources to help you prepare for your naturalization interview and test.

Here are just a few examples of what you can find at the USCIS Citizenship Resource Center:

1. A four-part video series on the naturalization interview and test. Topics include preparing for the naturalization interview and test, the naturalization interview, the civics test, and the reading and writing tests.




