INTRO TO FRENCH 1

Course Syllabus

2019- 2020

Class Hours: Every other day (Block schedule- A/B Days: 82 minutes) **CREDIT:** 5.0

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Description:

This course is designed to linguistically orient how students acquire and learn the French language in the Middle School & High School levels. They will study the State and National Language Standards along with New Jersey World Languages Curriculum Framework and apply these to innovation comprehension of simple, oral/written directions/ commands, and requests through appropriate physical responses, and demonstrate comprehension of oral and written instructions connected to daily activities. The course is for 9th graders -freshmen students- and/or first -time students taking French which means it will be accommodated to our scholars based on their basic knowledge in the French language.

Objectives of the course

This course will address the five C's: Communication, Culture, Community, Comparison, and Connection. The students in the class will use the French language and cultural knowledge to express themselves orally, and to create simple paragraphs while writing.

Standard 7.1 World Languages:

All students will be able to use a world language in addition to English in meaningful conversation, to understand and interpret spoken and written language, and to present information, concepts and ideas while also gaining an understanding of the perspectives of other cultures. Through language study, they will make connections with other content areas, compare the language and culture studied with their own, and participate in home and global communities.

Student expectations:

- **Interpretive Mode of communication**, in which students demonstrate understanding of spoken and written communication within appropriate cultural contexts
- **Interpersonal Mode of communication**, in which students engage in direct oral and/or written others.
- **Presentational Mode of communication**, in which students present , orally and/or in writing, information, concepts and ideas to an audience of listeners or readers with whom there is no immediate interaction.
